SEVP and SEVIS

The Student and Exchange Visitor Program (SEVP) manages the Student and Exchange Visitor Information System (SEVIS). SEVP is a program under the Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) agency within Department of Homeland Security (DHS).

SEVIS came online in 2003 to track and monitor the status and activities of nonimmigrant students and exchange visitors (EVs) who enter the United States. This web-based system collects real-time information on nonimmigrant students, EVs, approved schools, and program sponsors. This information is available to a variety of stakeholders. SEVIS also retains information on Exchange Visitor Program sponsors and visitors that are approved by the Department of State (DoS). The DoS web site is http://exchanges.state.gov/education/jexchanges/about.htm

This quarterly review is based on information retrieved on July 1, 2008. As SEVIS is a real-time data base, exact numbers within this review were accurate as of the date retrieved. The below list contains the various organizations that request data and information stored in SEVIS. SEVP continues to see the number of requests increase as SEVP's abilities and SEVIS' capabilities expand.

The SEVIS "General Data Quarterly Review" is produced to provide a snap-shot of useful information to SEVP management and a variety of SEVIS stakeholders.

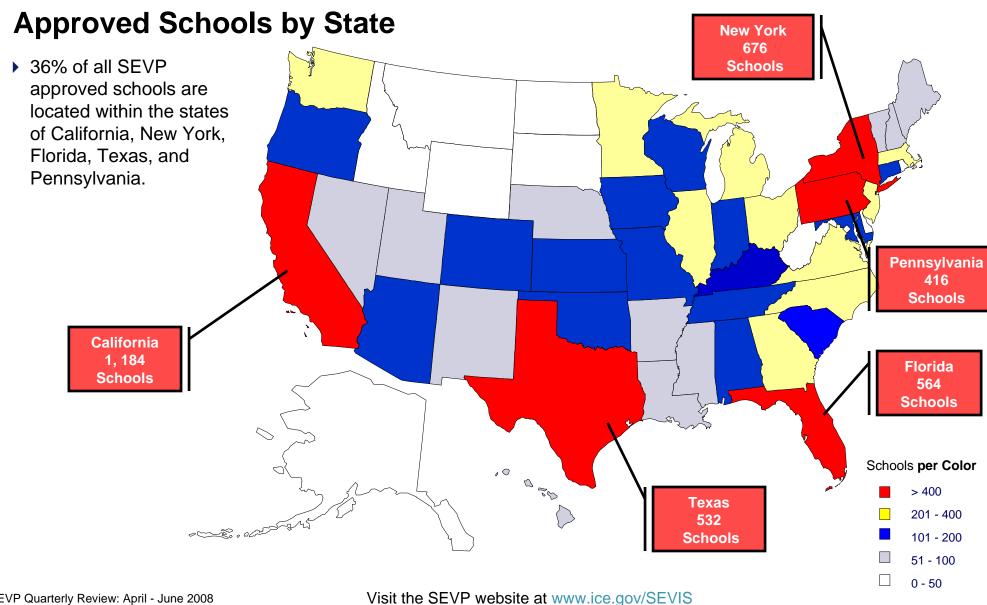
This edition of the review represents a sample of information collected from SEVIS data on July 1, 2008.

Since the program's inception, the total volume of data in SEVIS continues to grow. As of June 30, 2008 there were **1,052,694** Active nonimmigrant students, exchange visitors, and their dependents in SEVIS. Data on greater than **5.6 million** nonimmigrant visatype F, M, J visa holders and their dependents, schools and EV programs can be found in SEVIS.



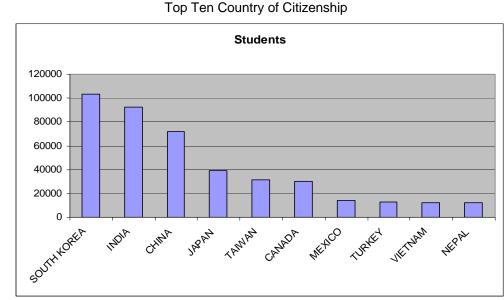

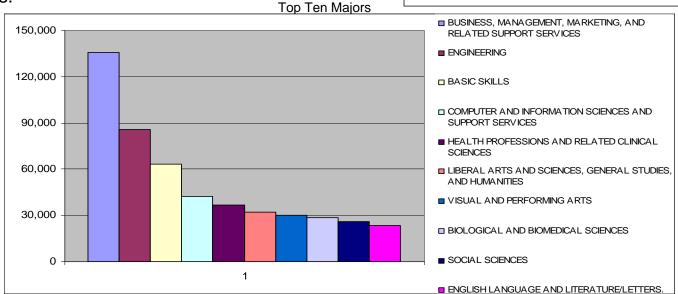

Geographic Region and Major

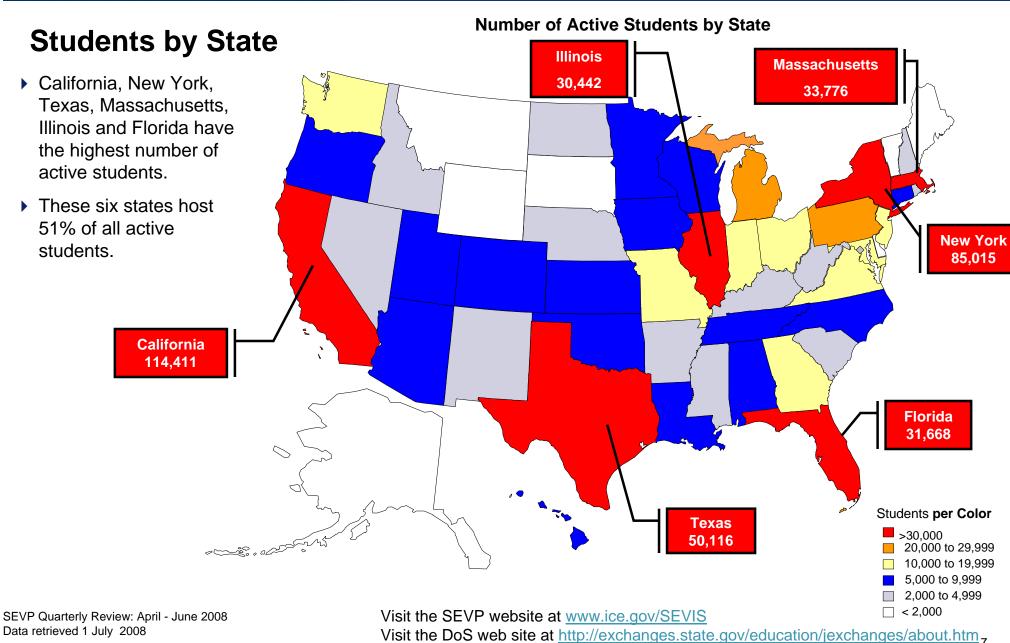
- ▶ South Korea remains the country with the highest number of Active students (103,389).

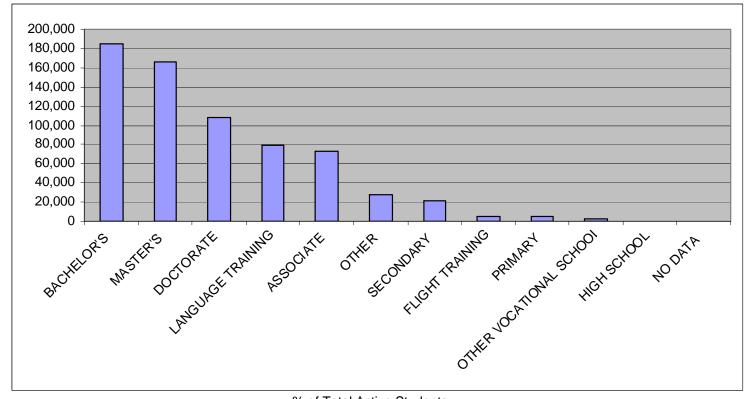




Level of Education and Course of Study
