It was with great interest that we read in the Caribou County Sun and on your website of the upcoming Public Meeting to be held on June 6 regarding the Caribou - Lower Valley Energy Substation and Transmission Line Project.

<u>From a community standpoint</u> -- (I have served on the Soda Springs City Council for the past ten-plus years and oversee Soda Springs' Municipal Power) – we welcome your targeted investment in the region and pledge our support to the successful completion of the Project.

From a professional standpoint, please consider the following:

- As you press forward under the NEPA, Environmental Assessment and/or the Environmental Impact Statement Processes, you may be required to consider "Alternatives". If so, please consider Mountain Island Energy, LLC's (MIE) property located approximately 1 mile SE of your proposed transmission line terminus. We consider our site as an ideal alternative for both your proposed substation and line termination – for the following reasons:
  - MIE owns 423 acres adjacent (east/southeast) to the Tronox, LLC (formerly Kerr McGee) industrial site
  - The Idaho Power -- Bridger to Goshen 345 kV power line bisects the MIE property
  - We are strategically located to the east of the 138kV Utah Power transmission lines.
  - A 46kV Utah Power distribution line crosses the length our property
  - Our site is being considered for new electric generation i.e. thermal power and/or wind energy to meet the need of existing and future planned growth in eastern Idaho and Western Wyoming
  - We have commenced fundamental baseline studies as a precursor to permitting our site for development.
- We are very familiar with the "local landscape" geographically, environmentally and politically. We would be happy to assist BPA and LVE professionally in the assessment, permitting, land and rights-of-way acquisition, engineering and development of the Project.
