I am very concerned with BPA's proposed 20-year power allocation policy described in the Regional Dialogue. BPA needs to retain its historical role regarding power allocation, conservation and fish recovery and not shift future responsibility for new power to the 100+ northwest utilities that currently rely on BPA for clean, renewable and economical hydropower. Shifting future power acquisition to hundreds of individual utilities is a sure course to a reduction in energy efficiency investment, reduction in renewables, such as wind, and increases the liklihood of more coal-fired power plants, which is a very poor solution to future northwest power needs.
