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Treasury introduces new Series I Savings Bonds

The Treasury Department has recently introduced a new Series I Savings Bond, the first new bond introduced since World War II. It is an inflation-indexed savings bond designed to protect the investors' savings against future inflation.

Series I Bonds are bought at face value (\$50 buys a \$50 bond), and come with an interest rate that is adjusted to always stay ahead of inflation. The current adjusted rate is 5.05%. The adjusted interest rate will guarantee savers a real rate of return, regardless of future

inflationary pressures.

Beginning August 1st, HRSIC (RAS) will be offering the new Series I Savings Bonds by payroll deduction, along with the existing Series EE Savings Bonds. Series I bonds will be available in six denominations: \$50, \$75, \$100, \$200, \$500, and \$1000.

Cold War Recognition Certificate requests now accepted

As reported in your April 1999 Retiree Newsletter, in accordance with section 1084 of the FY1998 National Defense Authorization Act, the Secretary of Defense approved awarding Cold War Recognition Certificates to all members of the armed forces and qualified federal government civilian personnel who faithfully and honorably served the United States anytime during the

Cold War era from 2 September 1945, through 26 December 1991.

Acceptable documents for proof of service are any official government or military document with recipients name, social security number/military service number/foreign service number and date of service.

Questions & Answers about the new Series I Savings

Q: When can I cash in my I Bond?

A: I Bonds are liquid and can be turned into cash anytime after 6 months to get your original investment plus earnings. However, I Bonds are meant to be a long term investment. If you cash a bond within the first 5 years, there is a 3-month loss of interest.

Q: How is the I Bonds earnings rate set?

A: The earnings rate of I Bonds is a combination of two separate rates: a fixed rate of return and a semiannual inflation rate.

Each May 1st and November 1st, the Treasury announces a fixed rate of return that applies to all I Bonds is-

sued during the succeeding 6 month period beginning with the effective date of the announcement. The fixed rate of return carried by a given I Bond will never change. Also, every May 1st and November 1st, the treasury determines a semiannual inflation adjustment based on changes in the Consumer Price Index (CPI) for all Urban consumers (CPI-U). The semiannual inflation rate announced in May is a measure of inflation from October through March; the rate announced in No-

vember is a measure of inflation from April through September. The semiannual inflation rate is then combined with the fixed rate of an I Bond to determine the bond's Earnings Rate for the next 6 months.

Q: When are earnings added to my I Bond?



Eight Americans are honored on the I Bonds, representing the diversity that built this country, made it what it is today, and will take it into the future.

A: Earnings are added to the bond each month. Interest is compounded semiannually. I Bonds earn interest from the first day of the month. The I Bonds issue date is the month and year when full payment is received by a bond issuing agent.

Q: How do I buy I Bonds?

A: Complete the I Bond section of the Allotment Start Form on page 3 of this newsletter. Make copies of the form if you would like to purchase more than one bond.

Q: What is the purchase schedule for I Bonds by payroll deduction?

"FamCamp" – Selfridge, Michigan becoming a reality



It may have started as idle conversation between a commanding officer and a boat mechanic several years ago. Neither of them really gave it too much more thought even though they both agreed that it was a perfect idea...and because it was a perfect idea, it mysteriously stuck around and was bandied about every so often, to no avail. However, the summer of 1998 brought onboard a new commanding officer who caught wind of the idea and couldn't let go. While the project is still in the working stages, the Fam-Camp is currently operational as a rustic site that hosts several enthusiastic campers each week. Tentatively the official opening will be held in late summer 1999. Until then, patrons may utilize the RV area, but must be fully selfcontained. Upon completion there will be 48 RV sites with gravel pads and grass perimeters that can accommodate up to 40' motor homes. Each site will be equipped with water and electricity. Other amenities will include a bathhouse with showers, pavilion areas, volleyball courts, horseshoe pits and playground equipment.

The FamCamp is located right along the shores of beautiful Lake St. Clair, a vast waterway in the Great Lakes chain. Selfridge will provide the ideal vacation spot to all eligible military and government employees and retirees. Since Selfridge is a major reserve training location in the Great Lakes region, the FamCamp will also provide an alternative for families wishing to travel with their reserve member on drill weekends or two week training periods. Costs are reasonable at just \$12 per night, and reservations are accepted up to 1 year in advance. The Selfridge FamCamp will be administered through the MWR's Outdoor Recreation Center. - 1. Active duty (soon they will all be enrolled in Tri-care Prime)
- 2. Active duty dependents enrolled in Tri-care Prime
- 3. Retirees and their dependents enrolled in Tri-care Prime
- 4. Active duty dependents, retirees and their dependents on a SPACE available basis only.
- * A very important thing to remember when getting health care, especially when you get specialty care if you are on Tri-care Prime, you MUST go thru your PCM (Primary Care Manager). The way to know if you are on Tri-care Prime is that-- if you are, you will be paying an enrollment fee each year AND you will have an enrollment card that lists who your Primary Care Manager is and give the phone number to call for referrals and specialty care.

Greenland Patrol (1940-1945) WWII Memorial

A World War II memorial dedicated to the Greenland Patrol (1940-1945), honoring its men, ships and stations, is to be placed near the entrance of the Coast Guard Museum at the Coast Guard Academy in New London, Connecticut. With its origin in May of 1940, this was the longest U.S. military operation in WWII. More than 50 vessels were assigned as well as aviation units and numerous stations ashore. These will be identified on

a large bronze plaque mounted on a tall granite pedestal colocated with four other WWII memorials there.

The memorial's dedication is to be held in conjunction with the Greenland Patrol Reunion in New London, to take place 22-24 September 1999. All interested parties, especially those who served in this operation are invited to attend the dedication ceremony at 11 A.M. on

23 September 1999. Those

VA establishes nationwide education information helpline

The Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) has a new toll-free telephone number for veterans and dependents to get the latest information on VA education benefits.

By dialing 1-888-GI BILL1 (1-888-

442-4551), veterans, dependents, school officials, veterans service officers and others can receive education benefits information, including detailed eligibility criteria and general background on VA

programs, 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

VA Under Secretary for Benefits, Joe Thompson said, "VA is committed to providing the nation's veterans with the very best in customer service. This automated help-line will provide accessible and efficient information about these popular VA services and programs."

Veterans, reservists and National Guard members receiving education benefits under the Montgomery GI Bill may also obtain detailed information on their personal benefits account through the new automated system. Callers can get specific questions answered by education case managers during regular business hours.

Education benefits information is

also available on the VA's Home Page on the Internet at www.va. gov/education. Through the education program web site, veterans can e-mail ques-

tions and VA program experts will respond.

Veterans and dependents seeking information on all VA benefits programs can call the department's general toll-free number, 1-800-827-1000, which will connect them to the nearest VA Regional Office.



New law reinstates Dependency and Indemnity

Public Law 105-178, Transportation Equity Act of the 21st Century, amended the law to provide for the reinstatement of eligibility for Dependency & Indemnity Compensation (DIC) when the survivors marriage terminates or when they cease living with another person and holding themselves to be that person's spouse.

Prior to this change to the law, surviving spouses lost their entitlement for DIC when they remarried or when they were living with another person and holding themselves out openly as that person's spouse.

For those survivors entitled to resume DIC payments, the first month of eligibility shall be the month following termination of the marriage; or the month following when the surviving spouse ceases to live with another person as married. Under this law, no payment may be made for any month prior to October of 1998.



Retiree Council Notes



This month CAPT Bob Houle of the newly chartered *Washington DC Area Retiree Council* provides the following notes:

On March 17, 1999 the Director of Personnel Management, RADM Olsen, chartered this newest Coast Guard retiree council, the tenth in a growing series, to serve the 3500+retirees in the DC/MD/VA/WVA region.

To get this Council off to a solid start the Coast Guard Chief of Staff. Vice Admiral Timothy Josiah. presented the charter to the Council's plankowner chairperson, Captain Bob Houle, USCG (retired) in formal ceremonies at Coast Guard headquarters with most council members and senior headquarters officials in attendance. As noted in earlier columns, the active support of the host command has been a key success factor in other councils' success - the welcome and sincere pledges of support this council received from both the Chief of Staff and Captain Percy Norwood, Jr., Commanding Officer, HQ's Support Command certainly bodes well for this newest council.

The retiree councils serve a vital need for both the active duty and the retired communities of the Coast Guard. To get a better understanding of this role it is useful to view "Coast Guard retirement" as a process that has four distinct phases: active duty, career transition, ultimate retirement and the annuitant.

 While on <u>active duty</u> career members need to know, and do, those things that will ultimately prepare them and their families for the capstone of their Coast Guard career -retirement. A smooth, secure, rewarding and anxiety-free transition is not an accident; it's planned while on active duty.

- The <u>career transition</u> phase of the retirement process is highlighted by making the transition to a new career and using that period to live comfortably and securely while laying the foundation for the third phase of the process, real retirement. Here is where the retiree's financial and emotional seabag is packed.
- <u>Ultimate retirement</u> is the third phase of the process, but hopefully the longest. This phase, sometimes the most traumatic, can and should be the most rewarding. The twin traumas of entering the "recreational" part of life and losing the traditional military medical system support can be a major challenge.
- The <u>annuitant</u> phase represents a final challenge for the survivor (statistically, the spouse of the active duty member but could be either). In this phase only one of the partners is left, with many of the supporting structures that made the three prior phases so enjoyable now gone.

Each phase offers challenges and opportunities. How can the Retiree Council help? Two areas:

 Facilitate service to the total retired cadre (retirees, dependents, widows/widowers; officer/enlisted; disabled; minority and reservists) by both the active duty commands and other members of the retired cadre. Retirees are a diverse group – to develop insight and empathy into the unique and varied needs of this community requires some level of coordination and constructive feedback.

Service by the retired cadre to support active duty forces in missions accomplishment (eg, recruiting, retention, sponsorship, mentoring), further develop public and political support for the Coast Guard and its missions, and assist active duty members, while they are still in "phase one," to prepare for their own retirement.

What's our game plan? We hope to use the retiree council as a catalyst to build a strong foundation to improve service to retirees by (1) helping them more effectively help themselves and (2) helping the active duty forces to better understand the retired cadre's needs and concerns and leverage their support efforts.

We look forward to working with our retirees and active duty shipmates and learning from other councils in the Coast Guard and our peers in the other services as we work to convert the Council Charter's dreams into reality.

ONE-TIME-ONLY SPECIAL ENROLL-MENT PERIOD FOR MEDICARE PART



The Health Care Financing Administration (HCFA) is offering a special enrollment period for Medicare Part B, to persons under age 65 who are both TRICARE-eligible and Medicare-eligible because of disability, but who have not yet enrolled in Medicare Part B.

If you're eligible, you may enroll at any time during May, June and July 1999. Your Medicare Part B coverage will begin 1 July 1999.

The Part B premium for 1999 is \$45.50 per month, plus any applicable surcharge. But, it's important to be aware that, if you became eligible for Medicare Part A because of disability on or after 1 July 1992, through 30 June 1999, and if you enroll in Part B during this special enrollment period, you will not be required to pay a surcharge/penalty payment for not having enrolled in Part B earlier. If you became eligible for Medicare Part A before 1 July 1992, vou'll pay a reduced surcharge/ penalty, because the months beginning with July 1992 through June 1999 won't be counted in determining the amount of the surcharge you pay.

If you don't enroll in Part B during this special period, you can only enroll during the regular enrollment period that occurs from 1Jan – 31 March each year. Part B coverage will then begin on 1 July of the year in which you enroll. The Part B premium will be increased 10 percent for each full 12-month period that you were not enrolled in Part B after you first became eligible.

If you enroll in Part B during this special enrollment period-and stay enrolled-your TRICARE eligibility will continue until you become 65. If you don't enroll in Part B during this special period, your TRICARE eligibility will end 30 June 1999.

If you enroll in Part B, TRICARE will become "last payer" for your health care costs on the date that Part B becomes effective, until you reach age 65. You'll remain eligible for care at uniformed services medical facilities, on a space-available basis.

If you enroll-or reenroll-in Medicare Part B, your Defense Enrollment Eligibility Reporting System (DEERS) record will need to be updated. The easiest way to do this is to take a copy of your notice from the Social Security Administration (SSA) showing your entitlement to Part B, or your new Medicare card showing your Part A and Part B entitlement dates, to the nearest military ID card issuing office. If this isn't possible, mail a copy of the documentation to the following address:

This action will assist in updating your DEERS record to reflect your current benefits, and will facilitate claims processing by TRICARE contractors. Be sure to include your (or the sponsor's in dependent cases), Social Security Number on all correspondence.

Y2K, you and your pay







With all the publicity about potential year 2000 (Y2K) computer system problems, you can be sure this question is going through everyone's mind, or will in the near future. We would like to pass along some information to the Coast Guard military family about actions that have been taken or are being taken to make sure that pay delivery is not interrupted at the beginning of the new year.

The Coast Guard Human Resources Service & Information Center (HRSIC) has responsibility for the operation of the automated systems that provide personnel and payroll support for the Active Duty, Reserve, Retired and Annuitant communities. These systems have been modified to be Y2K compliant, undergone extensive parallel testing, and are currently producing monthly payrolls. While our personnel/payroll systems have been dealing with some dates past 2000 for quite a few years, HRSIC's staff is continuing to extensively test the system with future dated data, on a computer certified to be Y2K compliant. The final phase of testing has been completed. In addition to efforts on Coast Guard internal systems, HRSIC has coordinated with all of its external customers to ensure data exchanges are not affected by the change.

While there are many external data suppliers/receivers, the most critical from a payroll delivery standpoint are the U.S. Treasury and the Federal Reserve System. Both of these organizations have very ac-

tive Y2K compliance programs. In fact, financial institutions such as banks that are members of the Federal Reserve System are being inspected by the Federal Reserve Bank Examiners to ensure their systems are Y2K compliant – this is a requirement to remain under the Federal Reserve System.

The Coast Guard is confident of its ability to produce a payroll and of the Treasury and Federal Reserve System's ability to deliver the payroll data. Even though we feel confident, we are continuing to evaluate and develop contingency alterna-

tives if there are financial system infrastructure problems due to the change.

If you are interested in detailed information on the compliance of other federal agencies such as the Federal Reserve Board, the internet has an abundance of information available and most organizations have their own websites. Automatic TRICARE re-enrollment program announced

WASHINGTON (AFPN) --Re-enrollment into the military's medical system became easier 1 May when the process became automatic to the customer.

In a phased introduction, re-enrollment is automatic unless a beneficiary declines the "Prime" option.

"The improvement will remove a burden on our beneficiary and improve the TRICARE Prime benefit by simplifying the process for our Prime enrollees," said Dr. Sue Bailey, assistant secretary of Defense for Health Affairs.

Beneficiaries will begin receiving notification from their regional contractors about the automatic re-enrollment 30 days prior to the anniversary date of their original sign-up with the military managed care plan.

Regions 1 (Northeast), 2 (Mid-Atlantic) and 5 (Heartland) implemented automatic re-enrollment 1 May. All other regional contractors begin automatic re-enrollment 1 June.

"Our goal is to streamline the re-enrollment process and to eliminate paperwork," said Dr. James Sears, executive director, TRICARE management activity. "Our Prime beneficiaries should be able to continue to enjoy the benefits of TRICARE without having to return forms every time their enrollment anniversary rolls around. A response to the notification is required only if a beneficiary wants to make

changes or disenroll from the Prime benefit."

Thirty days before a beneficiary's enrollment anniversary, the regional contractor will send written notification, and if applicable, an invoice for

the annual enrollment fee. The invoice will include options for full or quarterly payments. Monthly installment payments also will be accepted via allotment or electronic funds transfer, beginning next year.

A beneficiary may decline further TRICARE Prime enrollment, and may re-enroll at any time as long as he or she remains eligible. Beneficiaries covered by Prime who want to continue their coverage, but do not receive notification of automatic re-enrollment, or those with other questions about TRICARE, should contact their regional TRICARE office.
