### **USCGC Sumac Decommissioned**

After 55 years of faithful service, the USCGC Sumac was decommissioned 9 July 1999 in a ceremony under the Gateway Arch in St. Louis, Missouri.

The Sumac was built by the firm of Peterson & Haecker in Blair, Nebraska. She was launched on 14 October 1944 at the Peterson & Haecker yards in Blair. The Sumac launching was a very historic event in the Coast Guard due in part to the fact that it was the first Coast Guard vessel to be



pagne over the Sumac's bow just before she slid down the ways. When she was launched the Missouri River was exceptionally low, but even though the Sumac

had to negotiate a drop of about a foot she was launched without diffi-

Over the years, the Sumac called many different ports home. Her first

homeport was Owensboro, Kentucky from 1944-1946. From there she was moved to Paducah, Kentucky (1946-1951), back to Owensboro (1951-1962), Peoria, Illinois (1962-1966); Cairo, Illinois (1966-1968); Hickman, Kentucky (1968-1970); Dubuque, lowa (1970-1973); Keokuk, lowa (1973-1978); and St. Louis, Missouri from 1979 until her decommissioning.



During her time in service the Sumac and her crew were awarded the American Campaign Medal, the World War II Victory Medal, 3 National Defense Medals and the Meritorious Unit Commendation.

Over 300 people attended the Sumac's decommissioning ceremony. The invocation was provided by LT Patrick McLaughlin, Chaplain,

#### U.S. flags for retirees

The Commandant has provided guidance on the presentation of a U. S. flag to retirees in the following ALCOAST message:

R 081740Z SEP 99 FM COMDT COGARD WASHINGTON DC TO ALCOAST ALCOAST 085/99 COMDTNOTE 1800

SUBJ: PRESENTATION OF UNITED STATES FLAG UPON RETIREMENT

- 1. THE FY-99 NATIONAL DEFENSE AUTHORIZATION ACT ADDED SECTION 516 TO CHAPTER 13 OF TITLE 14, UNITED STATES CODE, AND DIRECTS THE SECRETARY OF TRANSPORTATION TO PRESENT A UNITED STATES FLAG TO EACH REGULAR OR RESERVE MEMBER RELEASED FROM ACTIVE DUTY FOR RETIREMENT. THE COMMANDANT IS CURRENTLY SEEKING AUTHORITY TO PRESENT FLAGS TO RESERVE PERSONNEL RETIRING FROM A STATUS OTHER THAN ACTIVE DUTY.
- 2. EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY, UPON THE OCCASION OF RETIREMENT OF SUCH MEMBERS, COMMANDING OFFICERS OF A MEMBERS LAST PERMANENT DUTY STATION SHALL PRESENT A UNITED STATES FLAG ON BEHALF OF THE SECRETARY OF TRANSPORTATION.
- 3. IN ADDITION, IN THE SPIRIT OF TEAM COAST GUARD, PRESENTATION OF A UNITED STATES FLAG IS AUTHORIZED FOR CIVILIANS WHO RETIRE TO RECOGNIZE MERITORIOUS SERVICE. THE FLAG SHALL BE AT NO COST TO THE MEMBER.
- 4. ENTITLEMENT TO A U.S. FLAG
  UPON RETIREMENT IS RETROACTIVE
  FOR REGULAR, RESERVE AND
  CIVILIAN PERSONNEL TO 01 OCT 98.
  MULTIPLE PRESENTATIONS ARE NOT
  PERMITTED. COMMANDS ARE
  AUTHORIZED TO PROCURE FLAGS,
  NSN 8345-00-753-3234, UTILIZING APPROPRIATED FUNDS, EXCEPT THAT
  FLAGS FOR NAF EMPLOYEES MUST
  BE PROCURED WITH NAF FUNDS.
  APPROPRIATED FUNDS MAY NOT BE
  USED TO PROCURE ANY OTHER
  ITEMS, SUCH AS FLAG DISPLAY

CASES OR SHADOW BOXES, THAT MAY BE PRESENTED TO RETIREES ALONG WITH THE FLAG.

Members who retired after 1 October 1998 who have not received a flag and believe they may be eligible, should contact their last unit.

## ID Cards & DEERS: Frequently asked questions



### WHAT IS DEERS AND HOW IS IT USED

DEERS is the Defense Enrollment Eligibility Reporting System. It is a computerized information system which contains over 13 million

beneficiary records used in determining and tracking military health care and base privileges. Every active or retired member of the uniformed services and their dependents, survivors, or unremarried former spouses are affected by DEERS.

When you are enrolled in DEERS, information about you and your entitlements go into the DEERS database. That information is immediately available to military clinics/hospitals, civilian hospitals, dispensaries, and TRICARE/CHAMPUS. Keeping your DEERs record up-to-date safe guards you and your dependents from being denied or delayed medical treatment, payment of medical claims, or using authorized base facilities.

Members should update their DEERS information whenever there is a:

- Change in their military status i.e., active duty, retired, TDRL, PDRL, reserve, or reserve retirement.
- Change of status of a family member i.e., birth, death, marriage, divorce, ward, or adoption.
- Change in address or telephone number.
- Loss or theft of an identification card.

## IF I UPDATE INFORMATION IN MY PAY RECORD DOES THAT ALSO UPDATE DEERS?

No. The pay computer system and the DEERs system are two totally different computer systems. You

must notify both offices of any changes.

WILL DEERS BE AUTOMATICALLY NOTIFIED OF MY RETIREMENT?

No. It is your responsibility to notify DEERS of any change in your military status.

## CAN I HAVE AN ID CARD WITHOUT BEING REGISTERED ON DEERS?

No. The DEERs computer system is utilized to enter and verify data for issuance of an ID card. If the required information is not in the DEERS system, an ID card cannot be issued.

#### DOES AN EXPIRED ID CARD AFFECT MY DEERS ENROLLMENT OR BENEFITS?

Yes. An ID card must be kept current in order to receive benefits. An expired ID card may result in refusal of medical treatment, payment of claims, or base privileges.

## DO I HAVE TO GO TO A COAST GUARD UNIT TO GET MY ID CARD?

No. The Uniformed Services have signed a cross-service agreement to provide ID card support to all eligible beneficiaries regardless of service affiliation, with only a few exceptions. The following special categories require issuance and renewal by HRSIC for retirees and their dependents:

- Initial verification for incapacitated dependents over the age of 21.
- Initial verification for unremarried or unmarried former spouses.
- Secondary dependent parent or parent-in-law, who require dependency determination.
- Illegitimate child of male spouse or sponsor.

### HOW DO I GET MY ID CARD RENEWED?

ID cards can usually be obtained or renewed at any military installation that has the ID card computer program. These sites are located at some reserve units, recruiting units, and National Guard units as well as military installations. ## MAY I RECEIVE OR RENEW MY ID CARD THROUGH THE MAIL?

Yes. ID cards may be processed through the mail with HRSIC for those who live far from an ID card site, are physically handicapped, are ill or hospitalized, or have no

means of transportation. Those who need to complete their application through the mail, should contact HRSIC at 1-800-772-8724 option 4 or in writing. Applicants will be sent an application to complete with their notarized signature and return to HRSIC along with an 8" X 10" color or black and white portrait. The portrait does not have to be a professional photograph; an enlarged snap shot is sufficient.

### WHAT BENEFITS AM I ENTITLED TO?

Category and age determine benefits. The following is a general guideline of eligibility:

- Active Duty Retired
   Medical Care/prescriptions at
   military & civilian facilities
   (TRICARE), Reserve Retired
   (RET 1), Commissary, Theatre,
   Post Exchange, and other base
   privileges (over age 60-drawing
   pay)
- Reserve Retiree (RET2)
   Commissary, Theatre, Post Exchange, and other base privileges (under age 60- no pay) and their dependents
- Retiree Dependents
   Medical Care/prescriptions at
   military or civilian facilities
   (TRICARE) (not Medicare eligible), Commissary, Theatre,
   Post Exchange, and other base privileges
- Retiree or Dependents
   Medical Care or prescriptions at
   military facilities (no TRICARE)
   (Medicare eligible), Commissary, Theatre, Post Exchange,
   and other base privileges
- Parent or Parent-In-Law
   Medical Care or prescriptions at
   military facilities (no TRICARE)
   (approved dependents)
   Commissary, Theatre, Post Exchange, and other base privileges

- Surviving Spouse and Medical Care at military or civilian facilities (TRICARE) children under 21, Commissary, Theatre, Post Exchange, and other base privileges
- Former Spouse
   Medical Care/prescriptions at
   military or civilian facilities
   (TRICARE) (eligible under
   20/20/20 rule), Commissary,
   Theatre, Post Exchange, and
   other base privileges
- Former Spouse
   Medical Care/prescriptions at
   military or civilian facilities
   (TRICARE) (eligible under
   20/20/15 rule) for one year after
   divorce, then option to purchase
   conversion policy. (divorced after
   1988), Commissary, Theatre,
   Post Exchange, and other base
   privileges.

## From the RAS mailbag

 When or how often should I receive a RASOMI (Retiree/Annuitant Statement Of Monthly Income)?

You will only receive a new RASOMI when a change is made to your pay or annuity account. These changes can come in many forms such as a annual COLA adjustment or when you request a change such as address change, allotment change and changes to tax withholding to name a few. Unlike the Active Duty LES you will not receive a monthly statement as long as no changes to your account are received.

 Since the installation of your new telephone system, I have been having problems reaching the staff person I am looking for.

In July's Retiree Newsletter we provided the written details of our menu (pages 5 &6). If you have Internet access, you can easily find all this and more on the Coast Guard web site at www.uscg. mil. This **URL** will take you to the Coast Guard home page where you'll find buttons that offer a variety of options.

The *News and Events* button takes you to a page where you can access press releases from Headquarters and all the Districts. You'll also find links to recent interviews of both the Secretary of Transportation and the Commandant.

The annual Seapower Coast Guard issue featured an interview with Transportation Secretary Rodney E. Slater in which he states his support for Coast Guard budget initiatives. "We need to make a long-term investment commitment to the deepwater needs of the Coast Guard. And, beyond the deepwater needs, we need to ensure that our people have the best equipment possible — from the latest computers to global-positioning technology. If we expect them to do the job with all they have to offer, then we have to make sure that we are doing all we can to ensure they have the equipment they need to do the job," the Secretary said.

In his interview with *The Retired Officer Magazine*, the Commandant addressed wide-ranging topics, including readiness, national security issues, budget, pace of operations, integrated deepwater systems project, national fleet and workload.

The News and Events page also offers access to a variety of publications that address current Coast Guard programs, issues and concerns.

The United States Coast Guard Annual Report for 1998 and the U.S. Coast Guard Fiscal Year 2000 Budget in Brief illustrate the value our Coast Guard provides to the American public through our maritime focus, military character and multi-mission flexibility. Further, both documents outline our principal goals for safety, protection of natural resources, mobility, maritime security and national defense in direct support of the Department of Transportation strategic plan.

Coast Guard 2020 describes the challenging maritime environment in which we expect the Coast Guard to operate in the next century, and it discusses the missions we will perform in this environment. It also identifies capabilities and competencies the Coast Guard must have to accomplish these missions.

The Commandant's Direction is intended to guide the Service during the term of each Commandant. It is the

Commandant's way of communicating to the members of Team Coast Guard — and that includes you — his vision and priorities for the next four years.

The News and Events page also provides links to the Commandant's Corner, where you'll find ADM Loy's biography and speeches.

Other buttons on the home page will help you find information about various programs and about services we provide, identify units and where they're located and even find your son or daughter a job that matters.

The *Organization* button provides an index of the Coast Guard web site. You'll find links to the Master Chief Petty Officer of the Coast Guard's web site and many programs and directorates.

Back on the Coast Guard home page, the *Facts, Images, History and More* button will again present a number of options. Click on the link to the Historian's Office and lose yourself in the rich history of our Coast Guard. Click the Images link to research and download high-resolution digital images of our people, ships and aircraft.

The Coast Guard Personnel Command (CGPC-opm-1) for officers and (CGPC-epm-1) for enlisted, start the process by issuing a recall order to the member. The recall order contains the effective date of the recall and duration of active duty. Information copies are sent to the Coast Guard Human Resources Service and Information Center (HRSIC), RAS and Military Accounts Support (MAS).

 Upon receipt of the recall order, RAS sends the Retiree a letter that includes a form for waiver of retired pay. The member is required to complete, sign, and return the waiver to RAS. This allows RAS to suspend retired pay, and the member to receive active duty pay and allowances during the recall period.

## Recall from retirement

- If the recall period is less than 30 days, RAS will not interrupt monthly retired pay entitlement. The member or active duty Personnel Reporting Unit (PERSRU), shall notify RAS in writing, upon completion of an active duty period. RAS will then compute entitlement to active duty pay and allowances during the recall period and issue a special payment for the difference between active duty and retired pay. HRSIC will issue a W-2 for taxable active duty pay received during the recall period and reduce the retired pay yearto-date taxable income that was waived.
- If the recall is for 30 days or longer, RAS will suspend retired pay entitlement and MAS will coordinate with the active duty PERSRU in accessing the member to PMIS/JUMPS. For immediate recall from retirement with no break in active duty, the PERSRU will electronically submit a Personnel Action P-193. NOTE: The member must carry all accrued leave forward. Ref: Coast Guard Pay Manual, Figures 10-2 and 10-3.

### IMPACT ON RETIRED PAY BENEFITS:

- On immediate recall from retirement, the member is placed on the retired rolls on the effective date of retirement and retired pay is immediately suspended. References may be found in the DoD 7000.14-R DoDFMR Volume 7B, Part Two, Chapter 3, paragraph 20303.
- A member originally retired for other than disability who, while on active duty, incurs a physical disability rating of at least 30 percent for which the member would otherwise be eligible for disability retired pay, is entitled, upon release from active duty, to retired pay computed on at least two different methods of entitlement; and depending on when the member first became a member of the military, before or after 8 September 1980.

#### Survivor Benefit Plan (SBP)

The monthly SBP premium cost is suspended for the duration of the recall period. Members returning to retired status following recall may only modify their original SBP election if there has been a change in marital or dependent status, or they are re-entering retirement during an announced SBP open enrollment season. Members will have a one year opportunity to terminate their SBP coverage beginning upon the second anniversary of receiving retired pay.

#### Recalled retiree pay computation examples:

#### Example 1 – for less than 2 years of recall:

An O6 with 20 years 01 month 01 day retires 1 June 1997 and is immediately recalled for 1 year. Pay at retirement:

#### 06 over 20 years on 97 payscale

\$5,478.30 <u>x .5020</u> (20 years 1 month) \$2,750.00 (rounded gross pay) At end of recall on 1 June 1998 active duty time increases to 21 years 01 month and 01 day. Pay upon retirement would be:

#### O6 over 21 years on 97 payscale

\$5,478.30 <u>x .5270</u> (21 years 1 month) \$2,887.00 (rounded) <u>x 1.3%</u> (partial 97 COLA \$2,924.00 (rounded)

#### Example 2 - for recall for at least 2 years:

■ An O6 with 20 years 01 month 01 day retires 1 June 1997 and is immediately recalled for 2 years. Pay at initial retirement would be.

#### 06 over 20 years 1 month on 97 payscale

\$5,478.30 <u>x .5020</u> (20 years 1 month) \$2,750.00 (rounded retired gross pay)

At the end of recall period on 1 June 1999, active duty time is increased to 22 years 1 month and 1 day. Recomputation of retired pay is as follows:

#### Method 1:

■ Pay would be computed as O6 over 22 years and 1 month using a .5520 percentage applied to the basic pay from the January 1999 payscale **only** if the member has been in receipt of this same basic pay for the **two year period** while on recall. Because there has been a new active duty payscale at least once a year since 1997 this recomputation method is not likely to be used. Or

#### Method 2:

■ Pay recomputed on <u>prior pay scale</u> or <u>pay scale used on initial retirement</u> plus cost-of-living adjustments. Member to receive the most advantageous pay, example:

#### O6 over 22 years 1 month from 98 payscale O6 over 22 years 1 month from 97 payscale

\$3,288.00 (rounded gross)

<u>x 1.0 %</u> (partial 98 COLA)



## Taxability of former spouse payments

When a retiree has a portion of his/her retired pay sent to a former spouse as a **division of property**, the amount is excluded from the retiree's annual taxable income.

In November of each year, prior to producing the IRS Form's 1099R,

the Retiree & Annuitant Service (RAS) office, reduces the retiree's annual taxable income by the amount of division of property payments made during the year. Also, the former spouse receives a separate 1099R for the division of property payments made to her/him during that tax

year.

Alimony and child support payments paid from a retiree's retired pay are not reflected in the year to date adjustments for taxes. If documentation of alimony or child support payments is needed, the retiree

### Your state tax liability



The fact that a retiree or annuitant does not have state income tax withheld from retired/annuity pay does not eliminate the retiree's or annuitant's liability for state income tax.

HRSIC provides a copy of your 1099R income tax information to the Internal Revenue Service as well as to the state income tax authorities. Each state has its own requirements regarding taxing military retired pay and annuities.

You may obtain tax requirements for the state in which you reside in a variety of ways including:

- Contact your local state department of revenue (generally listed in the "blue" pages of your telephone directory
- Obtain <u>The Military Tax Guide</u>.
   This is a supplement booklet provided by the Army Publishing Company. It is an excellent source of information on each state's rules governing the taxing of military retired pay. It also provides information on any new tax laws for that year. You may

order a copy by calling 1-800-368-8718 at a cost of \$5.

 Read tax information on the web by going to www.taxsites.com.

Military retirees are not required to have state income tax withheld from their retired pay. Under the law, (10 U.S.C. 1045), retirees may elect to voluntarily have state tax withheld. State taxes may only be withheld for those states that have entered into an agreement with the Department of Defense for withholding of state tax. All states that currently tax military retired pay have such a withholding agreement with DoD. Retirees wishing to have state income tax withheld from their retired pay must submit a written request to HRSIC (RAS) designating a monthly dollar amount that is to be deducted each month. The law **does not** provide for annuitants to have state income tax withheld from their monthly annuity pay.

### SBP upon remarriage



When a retiree no longer has an eligible spouse beneficiary, SBP spouse coverage is suspended and SBP spouse costs are discontinued. If the retiree later remarries, under the law, the new spouse becomes automatically covered under SBP one year after remarriage with the same level of coverage as the prior spouse. (An earlier date applies if a child is born of that marriage, or if a former spouse is remarried.)

Upon remarriage a retiree has the following options:

 Resume spouse coverage at the same level as the retiree had for the first spouse (under the "automatic" provisions of the law).

- Elect not to resume spouse coverage provided the retiree's election to do so is received by CG Human Resources Service & Information Center within one year of remarriage.
- Increase SBP coverage to the maximum level, if the SBP coverage for the first spouse was at a reduced level.
- Add Supplemental SBP for the new spouse.

It is essential that the retiree notify HRSIC upon remarriage, especially

if the retiree doesn't want the new spouse automatically covered under SBP, or if the retiree wants to increase SBP coverage.

SSBP annutitants receive 55% of a retiree's SBP base amount until age 62, and then receive 35% thereafter. Effective 1 April 1992, retired members may purchase an SSBP annuity that will be added to the standard 35% annuity payable to a spouse survivor age 62 or older. SSBP is available only to retired members who elect SBP coverage based on full retired pay. SSBP coverage is available in increments of 5, 10, 15, or 20% of the base amount. Added to the 35% standard SBP annuity, SSBP permits the survivor at age 62 to receive 40, 45, 50, or 55% of the member's retired pay.




