Subj: 2006 NATIONAL RETIREE COUNCIL MEETING REPORT

1. Background

- a. The Commandant of the Coast Guard National Retiree Council (CCGNRC) held its fifth annual meeting in accordance with COMDTINST 1800.5D from 2 to 4 May 2006 at Coast Guard Headquarters. In addition to the Co-Chairs, ten (10) chartered regional Coast Guard Retiree Councils were represented plus one "Retiree Council-at-Large" representative.
- b. One of the Co-Chairs provided representation at the Chief of Staff, Air Force Council. The Co-Chairs could not attend the Secretary of the Navy and Chief of Staff, Army Retiree Councils due to previously scheduled engagements.
- c. The Council had an ambitious agenda of briefings and discussions from staffs and organizations both within and external to the Coast Guard. In lieu of recounting the wide range of superb information passed on to the Council, we focus on those issues of potential importance to the Commandant and the Assistant Commandant for Human Resources.
- d. The Council would like to make special note of the exceptional support provided by the Military Coalition/National Military and Veterans Alliance, and especially the Military Officer Association of America (MOAA), the Fleet Reserve Association (FRA) and The Retired Enlisted Association (TREA) for this year's meeting. Besides the highly informative briefings, MOAA again sponsored a lunch for the Council in the Commandant's Flag Mess.

2. Issues

- a. **Armed Forces Retirement Home.** The Council positively notes that there is language in the FY 2007 Authorization Bill to include the Coast Guard in the Armed Forces Retirement Home. The outcome will truly be a win-win for our members and Service.
- b. **Benefits.** The Council notes the continuing progress made over the last year by the Military Coalition working with the Administration and Congress, in obtaining important benefits for active duty and reserve members, the retiree community, and their families. The Council continues to support those legislative initiatives that honor the men and women who serve everyday in harms way, made all that more visible with the Global War on Terror. Especially with the recruiting and retention challenges within various active

duty, Reserve and National Guard components, the Nation must keep faith with the relatively small numbers of service members who bear the majority of the responsibility for the protection of our liberties. Although our Nation is at war, only 1% of Americans are actually engaged. While recruiting is going well for the Coast Guard, the other Service's have considerable challenges that are not likely to get better with time. Keeping faith with this critical population will be one of the important keys to maintaining the all-volunteer-force (or more appropriately the all-recruited-force). We are concerned with the message being sent by:

- i. Proposed substantial increases in TRICARE enrollment fees and
- ii. Proposals offered by the recently conduded Compensation Study formed by a distinguished panel, but all very senior officers, that would radically change the current compensation system to one more on par with civilian systems.

While the Council certainly recognizes that changes in both areas may be both necessary and beneficial, we are concerned that they may be launched too hastily without due consideration of the long-term effects on the force.

c. Healthcare.

- . The Council again notes the tremendous strides made by TRICARE and associated enhanced benefits, such as TRICARE for Life (TFL) and the expanded pharmacy benefit.
- ii. The TRICARE website, www.tricare.osd.mil, is an exceptional healthcare information/access tool. Additionally, all Coast Guard members, especially retirees, should make note of the Coast Guard's toll-free health benefits advisor number, 1-800-9HBAHBA. All too often members are attempting to tackle complex issues on their own when expert help is readily available.
- d. CGHQ's Retiree Program Coordinator Position. The Council sincerely appreciates the support provided by RADM Venuto, CAPT Farmer, previous CO, Headquarters Support Command, and their staffs in helping to establish this volunteer position as recommended by last year's Council. Members of the Capital Area Council have readily taken on this mission and will be the "watchstanders." Special note should be made of CAPT Charles Glass, past President of the Council, and CAPT's Bob Warakomsky and Norm Lemley for their leadership and support. Some items to note:

- e. **Continuing Service Coast Guard For'er.** Through a series of briefs and discussions, a number of means for retirees to continue to serve were discussed.
 - i. Coast Guard Work-Life Program. CAPT Rodriguez, USPHS, Chief, Office of Work-Life was especially enthusiastic as to where his program could use retiree assistance. It is recommended that regional retiree councils make contact with the Work-Life Program supervisors in the field to understand local needs and match qualified/interested volunteers. Opportunities include transition/relocation program, health promotion, decedent affairs, financial counseling/training, and administrative assistance to the offices. The advantage of having retirees participate in TAPS workshops, to participate on panels or to talk about life after the Coast Guard was stressed; our CGHQ's Retiree Coordinator will obtain the CG-wide schedule and disseminate.
 - ii. Coast Guard Auxiliary. Expanded roles and missions for the Auxiliary, especially in the post-911 environment, provide many avenues for retirees to serve. Owning a boat and serving on the water is just one way; the Auxiliary needs good people with many different skills and willingness to pitch in and assist in many day-to-days activities of the Coast Guard, less law enforcement and combat-related missions. AMENDMENT BARS TRICARE HIKES

The Senate recently approved an amendment by Sen. **Frank Lautenberg** (D-NJ) that would bar the Department of Defense from increasing pharmacy ∞ -pays in the TRICARE retail network through Fiscal Year 2007. **S.2766** would bar most other TRICARE fee increases for at least a year and, in the pharmacy area, it would actually reduce co-pays to zero for most drugs ordered through the TRICARE mail-order pharmacy system. Members of the military retiree ∞ -munity are urged to follow S.2766 as amendments affecting the military are debated.

TRICARE Eligibility

Your key to TRICARE eligibility depends on your enrollment in the Defense Enrollment Eligibility Reporting System (DEERS). The DEERS record will indicate the dates of eligibility. All uniformed services sponsors (active, reserve or retired) should ensure that their family status (marriage, death, divorce, new child, etc.) and residential address are current in DEERS at all times. DEERS enrollment and/or updates are completed at uniformed services personnel offices, not TRICARE service centers. Important TRDP Benefit Information for Guard/Reserve Pre-Retirees and Retirees

National Guard and Reserve personnel who elect to enroll in the TRICARE Retiree Dental Program (TRDP) within 120 days after retirement are eligible to skip the 12-month waiting period normally required for certain TRDP benefits (such as crowns, bridges, and braces). All new enrollees seeking to obtain the waiver should submit a copy of their retirement orders along with their enrollment application.

It is important to note that as with all new retirees, the 120-day period during which a "gray area" retired Reservist or Guard member can enroll in the TRDP to qualify for the 12-month waiting period waiver begins with his/her retirement effective date, **not the date he/she reaches age 60.**

- iii. Coast Guard Mutual Assistance. CAPT Omri, USCG (Ret.), Executive Director, and CWO Barry Boisvere, USCG (Ret.), briefed on the assistance provided to Coast Guard Gulf Coast members and their families affected by last year's hurricanes. The Coast Guard family's contributions and CGMA's superb responsiveness to our people in need is a truly inspiring story. CGMA continues to be the very best way retirees can support today's Coasties and are encouraged to do so via allotments from their retired pay.
- iv. Coast Guard Historian. Dr. Robert Browning, CG Historian, brought the Council up-to-date on CG history initiatives, including the new museum in New London, CT. His office is in the process of collecting personal histories of Coast Guard men and women and made an appeal for those who may have important stories/careers to capture.
- f. Civilian Retirees. The Council was made aware that civilian retirees have made requests for a Coast Guard civilian retiree ID card. We also understand that some other government agencies do so. We have requested that the civilian retiree representative to the Council research this issue and provide recommendations to the Council.
- g. **Personnel Services Center (PSC).** Ms. Debbie Farley, Chief, Retiree and Annuitant Branch attended and briefed. The Council made note of the superb support provided by her Branch to all retirees and the regional councils.
 - i. The retiree records and pay system will be the first to move to "Global Pay" over the next year, as part of the service-wide move to a web-enabled pay and personnel records system. This will get us off the old Wang system and into the Coast Guard state-of-the-art personnel system called "Direct Access." Retirees will be able to make certain changes to their accounts on-line. Members of the Office of Human Resources Information Resource Management implementation team briefed us on their initial steps, and we will place them on next year's agenda as this effort will be in full swing by next spring.
 - ii. The Council suggested that a more appropriate name be given to the retiree newsletter "Evening Colors" as most retirees feel they are just beginning their next phase in life. It is suggested that consideration be given to renaming as "Coast Guard For'er" to follow with the theme/vision of the CCGNRC.
- h. Last Year's Report. The Council did not receive a reply to the 2005 report. Additionally, the draft revision COMDTINST 1800.5E was not acted on. It includes important changes: including civilian retirees on the National and Regional Councils, adding the "Retiree Council-at-Large" to the National Council, and establishing the CGHQ's Retiree Program Coordinator position.
- i. Retiree Council-at-Large http://www.fredsplace.org. CWO4 Fred Siegel, USCG (Ret.) of "Fred's Place" continues to chair the virtual "Retiree-at-Large Council." An "internal COMMCEN" website provides informal internal communications amongst the National Retiree Council and the Chairpersons of the Regional Retiree Councils: http://www.fredsplace.org/retiree/.
- j. Financial Items of Interest to Retirees. The Council received briefs from the Navy Mutual Aid Association (NMAA) (http://www.navymutual.org) and the Pentagon Federal Credit Union (PFCU) (http://www.penfed.org/). As both are not-for-profit organizations, they provide some of the very best financial products for Coast Guard active duty and reserve members, and retirees and their families. They are both well worth the effort to investigate when considering making financial decisions.
- 3. Summary. This was actually the third meeting of the Council "on its own," having previously been a participant with the Secretary of the Navy Retiree Council. The CCGNRC program continues to mature, due to a cadre of highly dedicated retirees. Significant value is being provided to those Coast Guard units and surrounding retiree communities where there is "enlightened leadership" at the commands. Retirees who are willing to volunteer their time, skills, knowledge and expertise to the Coast Guard community leverage the commands' workforce. Those supportive commanders and commanding officers truly understand that for a minor investment in space, resources, and time, and a good dose of respect, pays substantial dividends. The Council salutes their insight and will continue to encourage others to step forward BZ! USCG Retiree Volunteers Needed for Watchstanders

The National Coast Guard Retiree Council Headquarters Retiree Program Coordinator's Office Telephone/E-mail "HOTLINE" has been established, and is staffed by members of the Capital Area Coast Guard Retiree Council and other DC Area Retiree volunteers. More Area volunteers are needed for the watch list.

This Office will serve as a Headquarters point of contact for retirees needing assistance to determine whom or where they should direct their inquiries. The Office will be a valuable contact point between the active duty Coast Guard and the Coast Guard military retiree community. This is important in these times of organizational change within the Coast Guard and our changing benefits and programs. There is no intent to curtail direct contact if the contact information is known.

Space has been allocated in Room 5500 in HQTRS for the Retiree Program Coordinator's Office. It is equipped with a computer, E-mail, and telephone service. The computer has access to both the USCG Intranet and the World Wide Web. A voice-mail box, 1-866-664-6245, and an E-mail address, NRHD@uscg.mil, have been established. Retirees will be able to call or E-mail questions and concerns. CAPT Warakomsky, USCG (RET) is spearheading the program and is the Capital Area Coast Guard Retiree Council's Coordinator. CDR David DuPont, USCG (RET) is a HQ contact.

A "Watchstanders" list of Council members has been established, but additional watchstanders are needed.

There are actually two watch lists. The first is basically a HQ "retiree" team that has daily access to the HQ E-mail system. The second is the more important and main watch list of volunteers that are responsible on weekly schedule for "responding" to the inquiries by phone or E-mail.

The HQ "retiree" duty watchstander who monitors the MRHD@comdt.uscg.mil E-mail will forward the inquiry to the main duty watchstander, who also is monitoring the Help Desk telephone, 1-866-664-6245. A main duty watchstander will take appropriate action on both the E-mail and phone inquiries.

"Watchstanders" will not be expected to be an expert on USCG Programs. If the question cannot be answered, the main task will be to direct the "caller" to the right source. A Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs) file will available to "watchstanders" and will be a good information resource.

COAST GUARD ANNOUNCES FIRST EVER AUXILIARIST OF THE YEAR AWARD FOR 2005 Winning volunteer honored for his commitment to marine safety and community service

WASHINGTON, D.C. – Kevin J. Cady, a firefighter/investigator for the City of Portland, ME, and resident of Falmouth, ME, is the Coast Guard Auxiliary's first recipient of the New Auxiliarist of the Year award.

Cady received the inaugural award from Admiral Thad Allen, Commandant of the Coast Guard, in a ceremony held at Coast Guard headquarters in September 2005. The award recognizes outstanding contribution to Coast Guard missions by an Auxiliarist during their first three years of service. Cady, a Coast Guard Auxiliary civilian volunteer, was honored for his service to Coast Guard Sector Northern New England in the area of marine safety, as well as for his leadership skills and community service to Flotilla 21 of the Coast Guard Auxiliary's First Northern District. He also played a significant role in assisting Sector Northern New England (SNNE) Planning Department in identifying local stakeholders and developing the Area Maritime Security Committee for the Burlington, Vermont area when it became part of Sector Northern New England.

Cady served in the Emergency Operations Center during the South Portland Weapons of Mass Destruction exercise in April, 2005, as well as serving in the Incident Command Post structure during the visit of Queen Mary 2 in 2004 and 2005. He was one of three key players in developing the Auxiliary Response Plan for SNNE and testing the plan in a "call out" exercise in 2004 and in 2005. As part of the Team Coast Guard unit in the City of Portland Hero's Parade, in April 2005, Cady distributed America's Waterway Watch materials to bystanders along the parade route.

In addition to his duties with the Portland Fire Department and the Coast Guard Auxiliary, Cady serves as a season al Deputy Harbormaster in Falmouth, ME., and is a Special Deputy US Marshal. Cady and his wife Heather, have two sons - Griffin and Marcus.

Preventive and diagnostic services with no deductible or maximums add to TRDP value

Early diagnosis and prevention of dental disease is key to good dental health. The TRICARE Retiree Dental Program (TRDP) provides the coverage necessary to help enrollees maintain good oral health and often prevent the need for major dental treatment down the road.

Benefits available to TRDP enrollees include diagnostic and preventive care such as regular oral exams and x-rays, routine cleanings and fluoride treatments.

Diagnostic dental procedures like oral exams and x-rays-which are covered by the TRDP at 100 percent of the program's allowable amount and are not applicable to the annual deductible and maximums-help the dentist screen for changes in the oral tissues and detect some diseases at a stage when they can be more successfully treated.

Preventive care can also help enrollees avoid more serious dental problems in the future. Enrollees should start by developing good dental habits at home along with a program of professional care. Maintaining a balanced diet, limiting snacks, brushing and flossing daily, and making sure to have regular dental checkups are all important steps in maintaining good dental health.

The TRDP also covers such preventive services as cleanings and fluoride treatments for adults and children at 100 percent of the program's allowable amount, with no applicable deductible or maximum.

Coverage for preventive and diagnostic services with no deductibles or maximum adds more value to the TRDP and gives enrollees the incentive to take good care of one of their most valuable assets: their smile. KEEPING RETIREE AND ANNUITANT SERVICES INFORMED

There have been a few recent instances on retiree accounts where retirees failed to report the unfortunate passing of his/her spouse. It is critical when the spouse predeceases the retiree and Survivor Benefit Plan (SBP) costs are being deducted for spouse coverage. In one of these cases, the spouse had predeceased the retiree 20 years prior to the retiree himself passing, and PSC (RAS) only became aware of the spouse's death during final pay processing. Title 31, U.S. Code 3702 states "A daim against the Government presented under this section must contain the signature and address of the daimant or an authorized representative. The claim must be received by the official responsible under subsection (a) for settling the daim or by the agency that conducts the activity from which the daim arises within 6 years after the daim accrues..." Following enactment of Public Law 107-314 (Bob Stump National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2003), for claims presented on or after December 2, 2002, waivers of the 6-vear time limit can be made by the Secretary of Defense upon application by the secretary (Department of Homeland Security for U.S. Coast Guard) for amounts less than \$25,000. Any waivers submitted to Secretary of Department of Homeland Security would require dear documentation as to why the necessary information had not been reported in a timely fashion.

All retirees are reminded to inform PSC (RAS) as soon as possible following changes of marital status (divorce, death, annulment, marriage just to mention some), death of a designated SBP beneficiary, or any other changes which could impact retired pay.

VETERANS DAY CELEBRATION



MILITARY OFFICERS ASSOCIATION CONCERNED ABOUT GUARD AND RESERVE EDUCATION BENEFITS

National Guard and Reservists are being treated like "second class citizens" with regard to education benefits according to a key Military Officers Association of America (MOAA) spokesman.

Col. Bob Norton, USA-ret., deputy director of government relations for the 360,000 member association said in a July 9, 2006 Atlanta Journal-Constitution article, that, "under the law, Guard and Reserve troops are veterans for every single benefit except education."

That means they can't use their service towards college credits once they leave the Guard or Reserve like their active duty counterparts can.

According to the article, the Montgomery GI Bill, which was last updated in 1984, did not foresee reservists being called to active duty frequently. Consequently, the law terminated full college benefits to Guard and Reserve personnel once they leave service.

MOAA has tried to help remedy this unfair situation by assembling a group of about 40 military and veteran's organizations and some educational associations to try and get equal education benefits for those who served.

Presently, those who serve on active duty for more than three years can use \$1,034 per month for 36 months if they become full-time students. That benefit lasts for 10 years after they leave the service.

Guard and Reserve personnel can earn about \$22,000 for use if they are mobilized for 15 months and then go to school full time. They can only collect, however, if they stay in a Guard or Reserve outfit.

Opponents say that changing the current situation would hurt attracting and keeping people in the Guard or Reserve.

An opt-out Medicare provider is one who notifies Medicare that they are no longer seeking Medicare payment for their patients and cannot submit claims. TFL members are urged to check whether their provider accepts Medicare.

If you need to:

- ♦ Start or change the amount of State Tax Withholding (Retirees can call, e-mail, fax or use *IRS Form W-4, or state form. If using IRS form, indicate that the form is for State Income Tax Withholding, not federal, which state it's for and the dollar amount to be withheld, (minimum amount is \$10.00, no cents)). We cannot withhold state tax for annuitants
- ◆ Change your Federal Income Tax Withholding (Retirees use Form W-4, Annuitants use Form W-4P)
- ♦ Change exemptions or additional withholding
