ADJUSTMENTS IN RETIRED/RETAINER PAY, SURVIVOR ANNUITIES AND PREMIUMS AND RELATED FACTORS

The following Cost-of-Living Adjustments (COLAs) are effective December 1, 2006, based on the increase in the Consumer Price Index for Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers (CPI-W) through September 2006. The term "retired pay" includes retainer pay and the term "members" includes former members.

COLAs for Retired Pay

- The retired pay COLA for those who first became a member of a Uniformed Service before September 8, 1980, is specified according to the effective date of the active duty basic pay rate used to compute their retired pay as follows:

<u>Retired Pay Based on Rates of Pay Effective:</u>	<u>Percent Increase</u>	<u>10 U.S.C. Authority</u>
Before January 1, 2006	3.3 percent	1401a(b)(2)
January 1, 2006	2.8 percent	1401a(c)

- The retired pay COLA for those who first became a member of a Uniformed Service on or after September 8, 1980, is specified according to the effective date of their retirement as follows:

<u>Retirement Effective:</u>	<u>Percent Increase</u>	<u>10 U.S.C. Authority</u>
Before January 1, 2006	3.3 percent	1401a(b)(2)
January 1 - March 31, 2006	2.8 percent	1401a(d)
April 1 - June 30, 2006	2.4 percent	1401a(d)
July 1 - September 30, 2006	0.6 percent	1401a(d)
October 1 - December 31, 2006	0.0 percent	1401a(d)

- The retired pay COLA for those who first became a member of a Uniformed Service on or after August 1, 1986, who elected to receive a bonus under the provisions of section 322 of title 37 United States Code is specified according to the date of their retirement as follows:

<u>Retirement Effective:</u>	<u>Percent Increase</u>	<u>10 U.S.C. Authority</u>
Before January 1, 2006	2.3 percent	1401a(e)
January 1 - March 31, 2006	2.0 percent	1401a(e)
April 1 - June 30, 2006	1.9 percent	1401a(e)
July 1 - September 30, 2006	0.3 percent	1401a(e)
October 1 - December 31, 2006	0.0 percent	1401a(e)

COLA's for Survivor Annuities

- Retired Serviceman's Family Protection Plan annuities payable on December 1, 2006, under the provisions of subchapter I of chapter 73, title 10, United States Code, to the spouse or child of a member who died on or before March 20, 1974: **3.3 percent** (ref:10 U.S.C. 1434 (e)).

5. Annuities under the Survivor Benefit Plan (SBP) and Reserve Component Survivor Benefit Plan (RCSBP) under the provisions of subchapter II of chapter 73, title 10, United States Code; Supplemental SBP annuities under the provisions of subchapter III of chapter 73, title 10, United States Code; and benefits payable under the provisions of section 5 of Public Law 96-402, will be increased by the same percentage specified in paragraphs 1, 2, or 3 above by which the retired pay of the person providing the annuity would have been increased at such time if the person were alive and otherwise entitled to such pay. (ref: 10 U.S.C. 1451 (g) and 10 U.S.C. 1457(d)(1)).
6. COLAs for supplemental annuities paid to certain low income widows of members who were deceased before November 1, 1953: **3.3 percent** (ref: section 653 (c), Public Law 100-456).
7. Annuities for Certain Military Surviving Spouses (ACMSS) payable monthly under the provisions of section 644, Public Law 105-85, November 18, 1997, are increased **3.3 percent** from \$205.61 to **\$212.40** effective December 1, 2006. (ref: P.L. 105-85, sec 644).

Increase in the SBP Low-Cost Premium Threshold

8. Previous amounts with respect to which the 2.5 percent factor of the SBP premium (cost) formula apply are adjusted effective December 1, 2006, in conjunction with the adjustments in retired pay made under the provisions of section 1401a of title 10, United States Code (ref: 10 U.S.C. 1452(a)(4)(B)).
9. The amount with respect to which the 2.5 percent factor of the SBP premium (cost) is applied for participation upon retirement will be increased **2.2% effective January 1, 2007**, from \$635 to **\$649** (premium for this coverage would be **\$16.22** and the breakeven base amount would be **\$1,390.71**) (ref: 10 U.S.C. 1452(a)(4)(A) and the scheduled increase in rates of basic pay of 2.2% effective January 1, 2007 under 37 U.S.C 1009).
10. The amount with respect to which the 2.5 percent factor of the SBP premium (cost) is applied for participation upon retirement will be increased by an additional **.5 percent effective April 1, 2007**, from \$649 to **\$652** (premium for this coverage would be **\$16.30** and the breakeven base amount would be **\$1,397.14**) (ref: 10 U.S.C. 1452(a)(4)(A) and the scheduled increase in rates of basic pay of .5 percent, effective April 1, 2007 under Public Law 109-364, section 601(c)).

Adjustments in Social Security Factors

11. The so-called social security offset (reduction) in SBP and RCSBP annuities under the provisions of section 1451 (e)(4) of title 10 U.S.C. is based upon figures published by the Social Security Administration (SSA). This year's changes are published in the Federal Register, October 26, 2006 (Volume 71, Number 207, pages 62636-62642). The following changes affect the annuity computation of SBP/RCSBP social security offset for those individuals with an eligibility year of 2007 and later:
 - a. Average of total wages for 2005 is \$36,952.94.

DON'T BE A VICTIM OF IDENTITY THEFT OR TELEPHONE FRAUD

Recently a TRICARE beneficiary reported a possible telephone scam involving someone asking for personal bank account information. This appears to be an incident of phone fraud and is not a security breach or incident.

VA compensation payments and federal income taxes

If you retired from the USCG or NOAA based on years of service and are later given a retroactive service connected disability rating by the VA, your retirement pay for the retroactive period is excluded from income up to the amount of VA disability benefits that you would have been entitled to receive. The form 1099R reports the entire distribution because the income, when paid, was taxable under the law.

A corrected form 1099R which could support the decrease in taxable income will not be issued by PSC.

This policy is contained in the DOD Financial Management Regulations, VOL 7B and also is stated in the IRS instructions for form 1099R, which directs that the entire income distribution will be reported if a part is taxable and a part is not taxable.

Retirees who are affected by this policy should consult a tax preparer for assistance. The retiree should provide copies of the Form 1099R and the VA Award Letter to claim a refund of taxes paid on the excludable amount.

You may also claim a refund of any taxes paid on an excludable amount in previous years by filing an amended return on Form 1040X, subject to Statute of Limitations.

FORMER COMMANDANT ADM J. WILLIAM KIME CROSSES THE BAR



Admiral John William Kime, 72, a former U.S. Coast Guard Commandant who was passionate about maritime safety and environmental protection issues, died September 14, 2006 in Baltimore following a valiant struggle with cancer.

ADM Kime served as the 19th commandant of the Coast Guard from 1990 to 1994, where he oversaw implementation of the landmark Oil Pollution Act of 1990 and established the position of drug interdiction coordinator. During his Coast Guard career, he served afloat in deck and engineering positions and ashore in the law enforcement, marine safety and environmental protection fields. His assignments included commanding the Coast Guard district in Long Beach, CA, directing operations for the Coast Guard district in Miami, heading of the Coast Guard's technical division in New York and Washington, serving as captain of the port in Baltimore and chief of the marine safety, security and environmental protection office in Washington. He also was a key leader in the Coast Guard's response to Exxon Valdez oil spill.

After retiring from the Coast Guard with 41 years of service, ADM Kime served as Chief Executive Officer of ship management companies in the United States, The United Kingdom, Norway and Sweden, and as CEO of a quality services company in London. He worked with BIMCO, the world's largest private shipping organization, until 2005, and with the BT Federal Board of Directors until his death.

Born in Greensboro, NC, ADM Kime graduated from Baltimore City College- third oldest public high school in the United States- in 1951 and from the U.S. Coast Guard Academy in 1957. He served in deck and engineering assignments in USCGC *Casco* before assuming command of *Lorsta Wake Island* in 1960. He received a Master of Science degree in naval architecture and marine engineering and the professional degree of Naval Engineer from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology in 1964. He served at Coast Guard headquarters in the Merchant Marine Technical and Naval Engineering Divisions. ADM Kime was in charge of the structural design of the Polar Class icebreakers and was the first engineer officer on USCGC *Boutwell*, home ported in Boston. In 1977 he was a distinguished graduate of the Industrial College of the Armed Forces and was assigned to headquarters as assistant Chief of the Merchant Marine Technical Division. In 1981 ADM Kime served as deputy Chief of the Office of Marine Environment and Systems. From 1982 through 1984 ADM Kime was Chief of the Seventh Coast Guard District Operations Division in Miami. In 1986 he became Chief of the headquarters Office of Marine Safety, Security and Environmental Protection followed by duty as Commander, Eleventh Coast Guard District in 1988. ADM Kime was the 1993 recipient of the United Nations World Maritime Prize.

Survivors include his wife Valerie and two sons, Edward W. Kime of Bel Air, MD, and James G. W. Kime of Columbia, MD.

Admiral Kime was buried with full military honors at Arlington National Cemetery.

b. The maximum taxable wages pertaining to Old Age Survivor and Disability Insurance (OASDI) benefits is increased from \$94,200 in 2006 to \$97,500 in 2007. There is no maximum taxable wage base for the Hospital Insurance (HI) portion (1.45 percent) of social security taxes. Earnings in 2007 above \$97,500 will not be used to determine survivor benefits.

c. The Primary Insurance Amount (PIA) for benefit eligibility in 2007 is computed on the basis of the Average Indexed Monthly Earnings (AIME) as follows:

90 percent of the first \$680 of the AIME, plus
32 percent of the AIME over \$680 and through \$4,100 plus
15 percent of the AIME over \$4,100.

If you need respect, you will get it. both from the auxiliarist and from the active duty persons that you work with. Maybe I got considerable because I was a retired aviator captain.

Anyhow, I am still active in the program. Having moved, it has set me back some, but am getting back into the fold.

TRACEN YORKTOWN Retiree Council Dinner

Held at the Port of York (POY) on 19 September 2006 from 1730-1945 hours. Approximately 30 attendees including TRACEN's Commanding Officer, Captain Anne T. Ewalt. Master of Ceremonies, Jim O'Callaghan made the introductions and briefly spoke about the Retiree Council missions, aims and goals. Our guest speaker was Mr. Tim Cross, Chief of Planning for York County. His remarks included the history of Yorktown for 1631 until the present. Growth and development ensued and reached its heyday in the 1760's and 70's and never recovered from the siege of Yorktown in 1781 and a fire that ravaged the town in 1814. Today the waterfront is once again a hub of activity with: beach refurbishment, River Walk Landing that includes; a 395-foot main pier, located at the foot of Ballard Street, providing ample space for tall ships, navy vessels and regional cruise lines. The pier width is 20 feet. The depths at dockside range from 27' to 50' with well over 1000' of dock frontage. The second pier, smaller in size, is located behind the new restaurant and between the main pier and Coleman Bridge. The pier accommodates small craft such as day trippers and pleasure boaters visiting the new village shops and restaurants. Ample parking is available directly across the street in a new parking garage. In addition, a new brick walkway adjacent to the beach now connects the waterfront business and beach shoreline with the Yorktown Victory Center. Mr. Cross concluded his remarks by saying that "despite the new town concept, Yorktown has retained very much of its history and historical grandeur."

THIRTIETH ANNUAL GATHERING OF PTERODACTYLS

LT Anthony Cella, LT Steven Talick and their HU25 'Falcon' crew of AMT2 Ralph Turner, AMT3 Bobby Acree and AET2 Andrew Goodison received the fixed wing rescue award for superior airmanship and on scene commander performance during the early hours of hurricane Katrina rescues. The flight safety award was presented to the Sector Corpus Christi safety department, CDR John Danaher, LT Juan Posada, '98 and Ms. Jammie Fisher. AMT1 Cletis Milan of CG Air Station Elizabeth City, NC received the aviation maintenance award. Two awards surprised recipients. CAPT Krietemeyer, was presented with a Commandant's Distinguished Public Service award for his Pterodactyl leadership and other community service accomplishments, and CAPT Copin, author, received a Commandant's Meritorious Public Service award for volunteer Pterodactyl scribing. Also attending and presenting was RADM John Currier, USCG, Assistant Commandant for Acquisition.

Income Tax Withholding Changes

If you need to:

- ◆ Start or change the amount of State Tax Withholding (Retirees can call, e-mail, fax or use *IRS Form W-4, or state form. **If using IRS form, indicate that the form is for State Income Tax Withholding, not federal, which state it's for and the dollar amount to be withheld, (minimum amount is \$10.00, no cents).** We cannot withhold state tax for annuitants
- ◆ Change your Federal Income Tax Withholding (Retirees use Form W-4, Annuitants use Form W-4P)
- ◆ Change exemptions or additional withholding

Federal tax changes **must** be in writing. The original Form IRS W-4 or W-4P must be mailed to PSC (RAS) for action and filing, per IRS requirements. PSC (RAS) cannot accept a faxed W-4 or W-4P. Please mail to:
