# ADJUSTMENTS IN RETIRED/RETAINER PAY, SURVIVOR ANNUITIES AND PREMIUMS AND RELATED FACTORS

The following Cost-of-Living Adjustments (COLAs) are effective December 1, 2007, based on the increase in the Consumer Price Index for Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers (CPI-W) through September 2007. The term "retired pay" includes retainer pay and the term "members" includes former members.

#### **COLAs for Retired Pay**

1. The retired pay COLA for those who first became a member of a Uniformed Service before September 8, 1980, is specified according to the effective date of the active duty basic pay rate used to compute their retired pay as follows:

2. The retired pay COLA for those who first became a member of a Uniformed Service on or after September 8, 1980, is specified according to the effective date of their retirement as follows:

Before January 1, 2007	2.3 percent	1401a(b)(2)
January 1 - March 31, 2007	2.3 percent	1401a(d)
April 1 - June 30, 2007	2.3 percent	1401a(d)
July 1 - September 30, 2007	0.2 percent	1401a(d)
October 1 - December 31, 2007	0.0 percent	1401a(d)

3. The retired pay COLA for those who first became a member of a Uniformed Service on or after August 1, 1986, who elected to receive a bonus under the provisions of section 322 of title 37 United States Code is specified according to the date of their retirement as follows:

#### **COLA's for Survivor Annuities**

- 4. Retired Serviceman's Family Protection Plan annuities payable on December 1, 2007, under the provisions of subchapter I of chapter 73, title 10, United States Code, to the spouse or child of a member who died on or before March 20, 1974: **2.3 percent** (ref:10 U.S.C. 1434 (e)).
- 5. Annuities under the Survivor Benefit Plan (SBP) and Reserve Component Survivor Benefit Plan (RCSBP) under the provisions of subchapter II of chapter 73, title 10, United States Code; Supplemental SBP annuities under the provisions of subchapter III of chapter 73, title 10, United States Code; and benefits payable under the provisions of section 5 of Public Law 96-402, will be increased by the same percentage specified in paragraphs 1, 2, or 3 above by which the retired pay of the person providing the annuity would have been increased at such time if the person were alive and otherwise entitled to such pay. (ref: 10 U.S.C. 1451 (g) and 10 U.S.C. 1457(d)(1)).
- 6. COLAs for supplemental annuities paid to certain low income widows of members who were deceased before November 1, 1953: **2.3 percent** (ref: section 653 (c), Public Law 100-456).
- 7. Annuities for Certain Military Surviving Spouses (ACMSS) payable monthly under the provisions of section 644, Public Law 105-85, November 18, 1997, are increased **2.3 percent** from \$212.40 to **\$217.29** effective December 1, 2007. (ref: P.L. 105-85, sec 644).

#### Increase in the SBP Low-Cost Premium Threshold

- 8. Previous amounts with respect to which the 2.5 percent factor of the SBP premium (cost) formula apply are adjusted effective December 1, 2007, in conjunction with the adjustments in retired pay made under the provisions of section 1401a of title 10, United States Code (ref: 10 U.S.C. 1452(a)(4)(B)).
- 9. The amount with respect to which the 2.5 percent factor of the SBP premium (cost) is applied for participation upon retirement will be issued upon enactment of legislation establishing the 2008 military pay raise.

# New Web Site Allows TRICARE Beneficiaries to Manage Health Care Information from Home

November 13, 2007

FALLS CHURCH, Va.- TRICARE Prime and Prime Remote beneficiaries in the United States including Hawaii and Alaska can enroll online with the new Beneficiary Web Enrollment (BWE). "The new online system may be one of TRICARE's most convenient tools to date," said Army Maj. Gen. Elder Granger, deputy director, TRICARE Management Activity. "Beneficiaries can manage some of their health care information from the comfort of home 24 hours a day, seven days a week." Prime and Prime Remote beneficiaries can log on to https://www.dmdc.osd.mil/appi/bwe/ to enroll, disenroll, choose primary care managers (PCM), transfer regions, update personal information, add other health care information and request enrollment cards. BWE allows Standard beneficiaries to update personal information, add other health care information and enroll in Prime. BWE's link to the Defense Eligibility Enrollment Reporting System (DEERS), allows beneficiaries to update their personal information for both TRICARE and DEERS at the same time. Sponsors and family members can access their TRICARE information by using their Common Access Card (CAC), Defense Finance and Accounting Service (DFAS) "myPay" Personal Identification Number (PIN) or Family Member Account PIN. Enrollments and PCM changes are pending until approved and approval may take up to six calendar days. Beneficiaries can log on to the site to view the status of their account anytime and can cancel pending enrollments and/or PCM changes within 48 hours of initiating the transaction. To date, the US Family Health Plan, a TRICARE Prime option, is not available for enrollment on the BWE Web site. In addition to the new Web service, enrollment forms are still available at http://www.tricare.mil/mybenefit/home/overview/Enrollment/WebEnrollment to fill out and mail to a TRICARE regional office. Beneficiaries can also visit a TRICARE Service Center to enroll and get assistance with other health care needs.

TRICARE Management Activity, the Defense Department activity that administers the health care plan for the uniformed services, retirees and their families, serves more than 9.1 million eligible beneficiaries worldwide in the Military Health System (MHS). The mission of the MHS is to enhance Department of Defense and national security by providing health support for the full range of military operations. The MHS provides quality medical care through a network of providers, military treatment facilities, medical clinics, and dental clinics worldwide.

The TRDP has been a tremendous success since it first began in 1998--and the new five-year contract offers even more enhancements to an already comprehensive dental benefits program. Highlights of the new contract that will take effect October 1, 2008 include coverage for certain posterior composite restorations and implant services and an increase in the orthodontic lifetime maximum to \$1,500.

#### Attention Coast Guard Officers -

Early next year the Military Officers Association of America (MOAA) will call for applications from officers of the uniformed services to serve on its Board of Directors. Both Coast Guard officers currently on the Board will complete their service in 2010, and hope to have at least one Coast Guard officer join them in 2008.

Founded in 1929, MOAA is the nation's fourth-largest veterans association, with some 365,000 members. It has an annual operating budget of some \$20 million, and is governed by a 36-member Board which includes officers from the Army, Navy, Marine Corps, Air Force, Coast Guard, Public Health Service, and the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration.

Board seats are allocated by service and geographic region, and there are no quotas for uniformed-officer grades. Current Directors serve or served in grades W-5 through 0-10.

All officer — officers on active duty, officers in active status in the Guard and Reserve components, former officers, and retired officers — are eligible to serve as long as they are MOAA members. In 2008 the membership will elect 12 new Directors, who will succeed the 12 who will complete their six-year terms in November 2008.

There are three Board meetings each year. Directors receive no compensation, but are reimbursed for their MOAA-related expenses. Responsibilities include attending three meetings a year, plus whatever time is required for directors committee assignments.

Details regarding how to apply will appear in the January, February, and March issues of Military Officer magazine, which all MOAA members receive each month.

#### **Adjustments in Social Security Factors**

- 10. The so-called social security offset (reduction) in SBP and RCSBP annuities under the provisions of section 1451 (e)(4) of title 10 U.S.C. is based upon figures published by the Social Security Administration (SSA). This year's changes are published in the Federal Register, October 25, 2007 (Volume 72, Number 206, pages 60703-60709). The following changes affect the annuity computation of SBP/RCSBP social security offset for those individuals with an eligibility year of 2008 and later:
  - a. Average of total wages for 2006 is \$38,651.41.
  - b. The maximum taxable wages pertaining to Old Age Survivor and Disability Insurance (OASDI) benefits is increased from \$97,500 in 2007 to \$102,000 in 2008. There is no maximum taxable wage base for the Hospital Insurance (HI) portion (1.45 percent) of social security taxes. Earnings in 2008 above \$102,000 will not be used to determine survivor benefits.
  - c. The Primary Insurance Amount (PIA) for benefit eligibility in 2008 is computed on the basis of the Average Indexed Monthly Earnings (AIME) as follows:

90 percent of the first \$711 of the AIME, plus 32 percent of the AIME over \$711 and through \$4,288 plus 15 percent of the AIME over \$4,288.

A preview of the December edition of "The American Veteran" follows:

**MRSA** -- A deadly pathogen is spreading in our nation's hospitals: methicillin-resistant staphylococcus aureus, more commonly known by its acronym MRSA. VA has launched a nationwide MRSA Prevention Initiative to contain the spread of the super germ, reducing the infection rate by fifty percent.

## Lost Dog Tag Returned To Owner After 35 Years

On 7/11/07 my sister, our friend from Texas and I decided to hunt for Indian pottery and shells on the Fort Morgan Peninsula. While standing in the surf (about 6" deep) of the Mobile Bay I reached down into the sand and pulled up what I though was just shells. I didn't have a handful of shells, I had a dog tag with the chain still attached. It was a notched tag, inscribed with Davis, Harold D. USCG. At that moment I was determined to try to find Mr. Davis to return the dog tag to him or his family. I started my search with the internet and Google. I tried his name first and came up with 102 Harold Davis's. When the name search didn't work I tried entering things like "dog tag", or "lost dog tag". The Army and Navy both have websites on lost dog tags but I never found anything on the Coast Guard. On 7/12/07 I ran across a site that had CG locater on it & e-mailed asking if anyone could give me information on Mr. Davis, so that I could return the dog tag to him. On 7/13/07 I received an e-mail back from a YN3 Wali Locker in Arlington, VA. who informed me that Mr. Davis was retired from the CG and that was all he was permitted to give out. From 7/15 to 7/20 I looked up anything and everything I could think of on the CG or Harold D. Davis. Just my pure dumb luck I came across www.fredsplace.org on 7/20/07 and posted a bulletin saying that "I had found Harold D. Davis's dog tag & I wanted to return it to him if possible. however all I knew about him was that he was retired. On 7/21 I received an e-mail from CWO Joe Cornell saving he had an old CG Register (circa 1987) that shows a Harold D. Davis, Retired CWO and the city he lived in and please let him know if I had any luck. Now I finally had a place to start! Back to the internet to look up the address and phone number. I called the number listed for the address I was given, no luck, they didn't know Mr. Davis. I e-mailed CWO Cornell back on 7/21 thanking him for the information and also ask him questions like what does "CWO" stand for and were the numbers on the dog tag part of a SS # or just random numbers issued. I was flying by the seat of my pants trying to find Mr. Davis, I knew NOTHING about the CG. CWO Cornell e-mailed back on 7/22, answered all my questions and also gave me the address to the RAS office and suggested I write a letter and include all my information (i.e. name, phone # etc.) (Continued on page 16)

and an unsealed stamped envelope addressed to myself with a note to Mr. Davis. On 7/23 I also received e-mails from Jim Clifton, Lieutenant Commander, USCG, Retired and Joe Thomas also retired from the CG (I don't know Mr. Thomas's rank) with the same sort of information. I was out of town for a few days and didn't get to send my letter to the RAS office until 7/28. I followed CWO Cornell's suggestion to the letter. On 8/3/07 I received a phone call from Mr. & Mrs. Harold D. Davis. WOW that day was such a thrill for me! Caroline Kern, from the RAS office had received my letter and had called the Davis's with the information about the letter I had written and gave them my phone number. What a great lady she is! We have talked several times since and I have a picture on the way to her so she can see CWO Davis and myself. I e-mailed each of the three gentlemen that helped me and let them know I was planning on making a book for Mr. Davis with all my e-mails, letters and phone calls. I also asked what part of the country they lived in, since you couldn't measure cyber space. I thought it would be fun to figure out how far I would have traveled to each place if I had been in a car. It came to a grand total of 3,842 miles I would have had to travel. Thank goodness for the internet with the price of gas now days. On 8/17/07 my sister (Elaine), Mr. & Mrs. Davis and I meet for the first time (along with the local reporter). We had a great 2 1/2 hour lunch at a local Chinese restaurant. What a nice couple. Finally, I was able to return the missing dog tag! Mr. Davis believes he probably lost his original tag, which he says was issued to him in 1947 when he was 18 years old, around 1972, after he had just returned from Vietnam and was helping his daughter build a vacation home on the peninsula. They had been doing a lot of skiing, fishing and boat riding at the time. The dog tag had been rolling around in the water for more than 30 years. I have no idea how many hurricanes have been in this area since the 70's. The tag had several scratches and the chain had rusted. It was my honor and pleasure to meet and return a small part of Mr. Davis's history to him. Mr. Davis and I were so glad to finally get to meet each other. We have become great friends and talk at least every two weeks. I e-mailed all three gentlemen that had a part in finding CWO Davis a picture of both of us that was on the front page of the local paper. They have each e-mailed a picture of themselves so Mr. Davis and I could put a face with the names. I have also become good friends with CWO Joe Cornell, emailing each other quite often. Caroline and I have also become good friends.
