## What is a Compliance Consultation Visit (CCV)?

A CCV is a free on-site review of your business' compliance status. This is not an official inspection; rather an opportunity for you to learn what you need to do in order to comply with applicable federal / local air quality regulations and your permit.

### Are the results of a compliance assistance consultation referred for enforcement actions?

**No.** A compliance consultation visit is NOT an enforcement inspection. Any information gathered at your facility at the time of this review will NOT be discussed with Air Quality Division enforcement staff or used for any enforcement actions.

### Who can benefit from a Compliance Consultation Visit?

Any permitted or unpermitted source subject to an air quality regulation can benefit from our assistance. Compliance assistance and compliance consultation visits can be beneficial to a variety of businesses and organizations such as:

- Internal combustion engines
- Turbines
- Industrial boilers
- Hot mix asphalt plants
- Concrete batch plants
- Sand and gravel operations
- Sand blasting
- Coating operations
- Gasoline dispensing equipment
- Wood product manufacturers
- Dry cleaners
- Auto paint and body

Today's air quality regulations are extensive and complex. Penalties for non-compliance can be expensive. The Air Quality Compliance Assistance Program (CAP) can help.

## What is the Air Quality Compliance Assistance Program?

The Albuquerque / Bernalillo County Air Quality Division has established the Compliance Assistance Program to educate and provide assistance to facilities that emit regulated air contaminants in order to help them better understand and maintain compliance with federal air regulations and the facility's air quality permits when applicable. Participants in this program will receive guidance on operations that are subject to federal and local air quality laws and regulations. The program is a resource that provides guidance in both technical and general areas of compliance.

Our **goal** is to help business and industry maintain regulatory compliance through technical assistance, education and guidance, without the utilization of violations or monetary penalties.

This will help prevent the deterioration of our community's air quality by ensuring that permitted sources emitting regulated air contaminants operate in compliance with all applicable federal and local air quality regulations as well as reducing the number of potential penalties assessed by the Air Quality Division.
