SCOPE OF WORK:

The National Labor Relations Board (NLRB) requires asbestos air sampling services for fourteen (14) office locations nation-wide (see Table 1 below for specific locations). All tests must be conducted and/or reviewed and approved by a certified Industrial Hygienist.

TESTING:

Specifically, the contractor will be required to obtain three (3) air sample tests, per each location, using the PCM (basic sampling) testing method, for a total of approximately 42 air samplings. The preferred collection device should be the 25-mm diameter cassette with an open-faced 50-mm electrically conductive extensive cowl. Do not reuse or reload cassettes for asbestos sample collection. The air flow rate is to be between 0.5 liter/min and 2.5 liters/min. Where possible, a sufficient air volume for each air sample is required to be collected to yield between 100 and 1,300 fibers per square millimeter on the membrane filter. The fiber counts should be made by positive phase contrast using a microscope with an 8 to 10 X eyepiece and a 40 to 45 X objective for a total magnification of approximately 400 X and a numerical aperture of 0.65 to 0.75. The microscope should be fitted with a green or blue filter, as well as have a fitted Walton-Beckett eyepiece graticule calibrated for a field diameter of 100 micrometers (+/-2 micrometers).

Also, the contractor must conduct a blank test at each location prior to the actual test to ensure that the equipment is operational. These blanks must come from the same lot as the filters that will be used for the sample collection.

The samples are to be shipped to a certified laboratory for testing in a firm, unbendable container with sufficient packing material to prevent dislodging the collected fibers. Air samples should be analyzed by phase contrast microscopy in accordance with the National Institute of Occupational Safety and Health (NIOSH) 7400A method.

DELIVERABLE REPORT

After testing is completed, a Project Summary Report (PSR) is to be provided in the time specified, but no longer than 10 days upon completion of testing. At a minimum, the PSR is to contain a summary of the work performed, methods and procedures used; conclusions and recommendations; and copies of supporting

documentation. The PSR is to be delivered to the Contracting Officer's Technical Representative (COTR), who will be named at the time of award.

PERIOD OF PERFORMANCE

All air samplings ordered must be completed by May 4, 2007.

AWARD

NLRB will use Federal Acquisition Regulations Parts 8, 12, and 13. The Government intends to award a Blanket Purchase Agreement (BPA) for a portion of these services from the date of award through the period of performance sited above. The Government will only be obligated to the extent of authorized purchases actually made against the BPA.
