

My wife and I recently retired and have started to travel extensively in our RV. To get our mail, we are using a mail forwarding service in South Dakota. I have been told that the government will not provide the \$40 coupon for digital to analog converters to those, like me, who use such a mail forwarding service because that is a "business address." I am assuming that this regulatory limitation is intended to prevent businesses from profiting from this coupon. Whatever the merits or rationale for limiting the use of coupons by businesses, it certainly has no relevance to our situation since we clearly are not a business.

I would strongly urge you to reconsider this policy and allow those who have only a post office address to benefit from this program. If this policy is not going to be amended, I would like an explanation for this decision and the name and title of the official who has made that decision.
