Revised Occupational Injury and Illness Case Classification Terminology

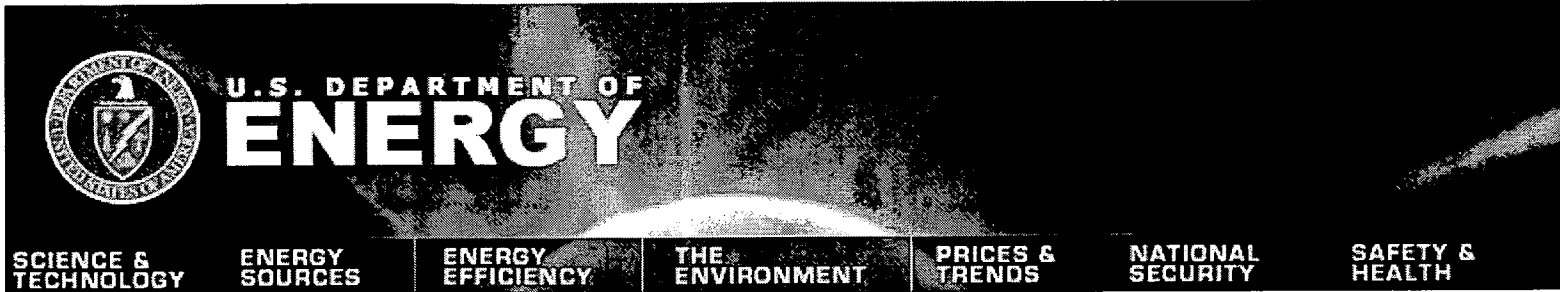
One of the recent revisions to CAIRS included updating DOE terminology used to classify injury and illness cases to make it consistent with terms currently used on the OSHA Form 300, *Log of Work-Related Injuries and Illnesses*. The table below provides a quick reference to the old and new terminology.

Current Terminology	Former Terminology
TRC (Total Recordable Case), the total number of work related injuries or illnesses that resulted in "death", "days away from work", "job transfer or restriction" or "other recordable case" as identified in columns G, H, I, and J of the OSHA Form 300.	TRC (Total Recordable Case), the total number of work-related deaths, illnesses, or injuries which resulted in loss of consciousness, restriction of work or motion, transfer to another job, or required medical treatment beyond first aid.
DART (Days Away, Restricted or on Job Transfer), the number of days away from work plus the number of days on restricted work activity or job transfer (OSHA Form 300 columns K plus L).	LWD (Lost Workdays), the number of workdays (consecutive or not), beyond the day of injury or onset of illness, the employee was away from work or limited to restricted work activity because of an occupational injury or illness.
DART Case , an injury or illness case where the most serious outcome of the case, as identified on the OSHA Form 300 columns H or I, resulted in days away from work or days of job restriction or transfer.	LWC (Lost Workday Case), a case that involves days away from work or days of restricted work activity, or both.
DAFW (Days Away From Work), the number of days away from work, as identified on the OSHA Form 300 in column K.	WDL (Workdays Lost) the number of days away from work only.
DAFWC (Days Away From Work Case) an injury or illness case where the most serious outcome of the case, as identified on the OSHA Form 300 column H, resulted in days away from work.	DAFWC (Days Away From Work Case), a case involving one or more days away from work.
DTR (Days On Job Transfer Or Restriction), the number of days on job transfer or restriction, as identified on the OSHA Form 300 in column L.	WDLR (Workdays Lost Restricted) the number of workdays (consecutive or not) on which because of injury or illness: (1) The employee was assigned to another job on a temporary basis; or (2) the employee worked at a permanent job less than full time; or (3) the employee worked at a permanently assigned job but could not perform all duties normally connected with it.
NFC (Non-fatal Case Without DART), a case where the most serious outcome of the case was identified as "other recordable cases" on the OSHA Form 300 column J.	NFC - Non-Fatal Cases without lost workdays

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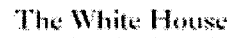
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
