CONGRESSMAN HASTINGS TO MARK COMPLETION OF PLUTONIUM STABILIZATION

Long considered one of Hanford's most challenging and critical projects, the stabilization and packaging of Hanford's remaining plutonium is nearly complete.

This week, the U.S. Department of Energy Richland Operations Office (DOE-RL) and contractor Fluor Hanford finish work on the plutonium left over from Hanford's production era -- greatly reducing the risk to workers and the surrounding environment, and eliminating the first of Hanford's three urgent risks (along with spent nuclear fuel and liquid tank waste).

Reporters are invited to enter the heavily-guarded Plutonium Finishing Plant complex for what could be the final time before the material leaves the Hanford Site. DOE and Fluor will provide "B Roll" tapes of the final stabilization and packaging work, and interviews with ceremony speakers will be available.
