- Monterey Dunes Natural History Association Students learn about the unique dune ecosystem by collecting, propagating, and planting native species in order to restore degraded dunes around Monterey Bay.
- Anzar High School Students assess the environmental health, economic impact, and public policies of the Pajaro River watershed through research, monitoring, and data collection.
- Multicultural Education for Resource Issues Threatening Oceans (MERITO) - Teachers receive instruction on watershed, estuarine, and marine science activities and help sutdents build a sense of environmental stewardship through projects such as clean-ups, restoration, and water quality monitoring.
