Parkwide Firewood Restriction Aims to Prevent Spread of Destructive Beetle

TRIANGLE, VA - On August 26, 2008, biologists at Prince William Forest Park, a unit of the National Park Service located in Triangle ,VA, instituted a temporary restriction on bringing outside firewood into the park for camping. Firewood not collected in the park may contain non- native insects such as Emerald Ash Borer and Asian Longhorned Beetle which carry with them diseases that threaten park resources and the health of our forests. Wood that is dead and downed, and less than 6 inches in diameter can be collected inside designated park areas for use by individuals camping in the park.

Management of trees infected with these pests involves drastic measures – the complete removal of all trees (infested and otherwise) in the immediate and surrounding areas. Both beetles can be easily spread in firewood, which may look normal, but still be infested with the immature stage of these insects. The ash borer infects mostly species of ash trees. The longhorned beetle attacks maple, elm, horse chestnut and other hardwoods. There are specific quarantines that restrict the removal of wood products from Prince William County, Fairfax County, Fauquier County, Loudoun County, Alexandria City, Falls Church, Manassas, and the states of Maryland, Illinois, Indiana, Michigan, Ohio and parts of New York and New Jersey. The park is the publics cooperation to help keep these harmful insects out of the 15,000 acre Prince William Forest Park.
