If you are uncertain as to whether your lighter is prohibited, please leave it at home.

\*\*\* Up to 4 books of safety (non-strike anywhere) matches are permitted as carry-on items, **but all matches are prohibited in checked baggage.**

### More Information on Medication

All medications in any form or type (for instance, pills, injectables, or homeopathic) and associated supplies (syringes, Sharps disposal container, pre-loaded syringes, jet injectors, pens, infusers, etc.) are allowed through the security checkpoint once they have been screened. Liquid, gel and/or aerosol medications are permitted in reasonable amounts and should be declared to a security officer at the checkpoint. We recommend that they are labeled to assist with the screening process.

## **Permitted and Prohibited Items**

The prohibited and permitted items list is not intended to be all-inclusive and is updated as necessary. To ensure traveler's security, transportation security officers (TSOs) may determine that an item not on the prohibited items chart is prohibited. In addition, the TSO may also determine that an item on the permitted chart is dangerous and therefore may not be brought through the security checkpoint.
