- Leverage industry best practices to deliver quality HIV/AIDS medicines and supplies at the best value
- Promote transparency

- Create sustainable solutions that will last beyond SCMS



Global Supply Chain: Commodities

- Antiretroviral (ARV) Drugs
 - Including FDA tentatively approved generics
- Rapid HIV test kits
- Laboratory equipment (e.g., EIA, CD4, NAT)
- Drugs for opportunistic infections
- Drugs for sexually transmitted infections
- Drugs for home care and palliative care
- Drugs for tuberculosis
- Medical supplies
- Miscellaneous (e.g., vehicles)

Strategy for Reducing ARV Prices

Lowering the cost of medicines reduces one of the key barriers to providing treatment and helps:

- Treat more people with the same amount of funds
- Reach rapidly increasing scale-up requirements

Governments and donors worldwide are working to lower the cost of HIV/AIDS treatment. Success will depend on:


- Collaboration to make prices and transactions transparent
- Shared access for all purchasers to prices and terms achieved by any organization

PEPFAR and SCMS have secured lower prices for ARVs by:

- Pooling procurement (consolidating multiple orders to buy in larger volumes)
- Purchasing generics whenever possible
- Establishing long-term, indefinite quantity contracts with manufacturers, leveraging lower prices through bulk purchases




As Countries Scale up Testing, Number of Test Kits Delivered Grows






Increasing Deliveries of Laboratory Supplies to Support Testing and Treatment Programs





Local Supply Chains: Rwanda

- Partnership with Government of Rwanda joint tendering and procurement of commodities supported by PEPFAR and the Global Fund
- For one order, cost savings of 23% compared with previous orders by buying generics at SCMS prices— enough to potentially treat 3,000 more adults for one year
- Enhancing procurement and warehouse management systems; physical and operational improvements to central warehousing and distribution





Local Supply Chains: Côte d'Ivoire

- National quantification a 24-month forecast and supply plan for ARVs
- Cost savings of about US\$1 million compared to earlier ARV purchases by buying generics and negotiating improved prices
- Averted stockout by procuring \$6.32 million ARV order (additional US\$1 million saved)
- Developed a forecast of lab supplies for HIV/AIDS program sites





SCMS has Helped Avert a Number of Stock-outs

Côte d'Ivoire

 Averted a stock out by procuring a \$6.32 million ARV order that saved an additional US\$1 million

Mozambique

- Mozambique's Ministry of Health had a severe shortfall of an ARV due to delays from their supplier
- Supplied two months' worth of the ARVs from strategically held stock held in the Kenya Regional Distribution Center (May 2007)

Zambia

- Shortage of an essential ARV drug that was already in inventory at the Ghana RDC
- Delivered enough bottles to treat patients for two months to meet short-term need (January 2007)

Zimbabwe

- Delivered SCMS' first shipment of HIV rapid test kits as existing stocks were running low in the country
- Filled the order in just three weeks, pulling stock from the South Africa RDC (August 2007)



Global Collaboration Highlights

- Serves as Technical Secretariat for Global Fund, the World Bank and PEPFAR Coordinated Procurement Working Group
- Global Fund pooled procurement study
- Ecumenical Pharmaceutical Network (EPN) and SCMS task force to support scale-up in Africa by EPN members
- Public-private partnership to address treatment needs of children with HIV/AIDS
- Procurement data for ARVs and diagnostics for the WHO AIDS Medicine and Diagnostic Service Global Price Reporting Mechanism



Conclusion: Overall Cost Savings

90% of ARVs purchased by SCMS are generic, resulting in \$107.9 million in saving
