Re: Site Technology Coordination Group

Dear Mssrs. Klein and Schepens,

Hanford's Site Technology Coordination Group (STCG) included senior Department of Energy (DOE) managers, contractors, regulators, tribes and three members of the Hanford Advisory Board (Board). It met each month and provided an opportunity for individuals interested in the technology needs of the site to be briefed on program needs, as well as the testing and deployment of science and technology required for cleanup activity at Hanford.

The STCG provided the opportunity for Board members, tribes, regulators, DOE site program and project managers, and contractor companies to gather and discuss common challenges. Funding requests for science or technology were reviewed and prioritized by the group.

The current administration cancelled funding for STCG coordination and the group was disbanded. Stakeholders have requested several times that DOE provide another forum for discussion of Hanford's science and technology needs. No such ongoing meetings have been arranged to date.

Hanford still faces daunting challenges that require new or better technology. The STCG was an excellent mechanism to screen ideas and prioritize DOE technology investments in areas of highest need and greatest potential.

The Board requests that an ongoing forum be created with the previous participating organizations of the STCG. Although funding for the DOE Environmental Management Science Program has been significantly diminished, some money is still available. Stakeholders deserve to know what science and technology requests are being developed to address immediate and long-term Hanford cleanup challenges.

The DOE – Office of River Protection (DOE-ORP) has made an ongoing effort to keep the Board's Tank Waste Committee informed about science and technology issues. The Board's primary concern relates to program areas under the direction of DOE-Richland Operations (DOE-RL). However, we encourage participation of DOE-ORP and DOE-RL in any forum that is created, in order to ensure that full cross-program integration occurs.
