## Advice

- Two principles of accountability should continue to be served by these meetings: (1) The opportunity to raise questions/concerns from the public to the Tri-Party agencies' decision-makers and to receive a public response or commitment to respond from them and; (2) To have a dialogue regarding whether agency plans and responses reflect public values and commitments.
- Active facilitation should be brought in early and maintained throughout the entire process. The facilitator should work with the public and the agencies

The Board looks forward to continued collaboration between the Board's Public Involvement Committee and the agencies to help shape a successful public process for the State of the Site meetings for each location.
