## ADVICE TO THE TRI-PARTIES CONSENSUS ON PRINCIPLES REGARDING THE ENVIRONMENTAL REMEDIATION DISPOSAL FACILITY (ERDF) AND REMAINING ISSUES

July 7/8,1994

At the July 7/8, 1994 Board meeting, consensus was reached on the following principles regarding ERDF:

- 1. There is a need for a disposal facility.
- 2. The facility should be limited to waste from Hanford cleanup.
- 3. In order to carry out the values of protecting the Columbia River and getting on with the cleanup, work should proceed on the planning and design of the first phase without commitment to a specific site. The agencies must address and respond to the issues that have been raised in the small groups in an expeditious manner. A list of these issues is attached.

**Statement of Intent**: With respect to the word "commitment" as used above, the intent is not to commit a considerable amount of money to a particular site, in an irrevocable manner. With respect to the word "expeditious", as used above, the expeditious response will be done in the context of public involvement, including working with the Hanford Advisory Board.
