Subject: Tri-Party Response to HAB Advice

Dear Messrs. Fitzsimmons and French:

The Hanford Advisory Board (HAB) continues to be disappointed in the agencies' response to HAB advice (#90 and #93) that urged the speedy development of Tri-Party Agreement (TPA) milestones governing tank waste treatment. The Board took the unprecedented step of offering TPA milestones in its advice in order to highlight both the importance of such milestones and the ability of over thirty diverse interests to agree on this critical project's future.

The U.S. Department of Energy's (DOE) refusal to date to commit to comprehensive enforceable milestones for the tank waste treatment -- in or outside the context of the BNFL contract -- runs directly counter to the Board's core values and advice.

Program success depends on agency cooperation and a strong TPA. The Board urges the Washington State Department of Ecology (Ecology) and DOE to take prompt action in order to break the impasse. If a resolution is not reached on or before September 17th, Ecology should issue a "final determination" (an Ecology order outlining compliance requirements) as is provided for in the Agreement in Principle (24 March 1999).

We look forward to your response and to periodic progress updates on this matter.
