Re: Member Participation

In the continually changing atmosphere surrounding activities on the Hanford site, it is helpful to occasionally review the needs and requirements of all organizations concerned with Hanford cleanup. Being mindful of Hanford Advisory Board (Board) members' changes in interest and personnel, the Board is providing this information to all designated seat holders to reinforce understanding of requirements under our original charter and expectations of Board member participation.

The Board's goal is to have actively participating seats. That goal is achieved through formal charter requirements and informal participation expectations. While the charter dictates minimum attendance requirements at Board meetings, the Board encourages active participation in Board meetings, the Board's committees, workshops, conference calls, etc. Work outside of Board meetings is the foundation of a credible, successful, proactive Board and the participation of each member contributes to this foundation.

Formally, the Board charter states that if an interest's seat is vacant for more than 25% of the meetings in a year or three meetings in a row, the seat shall be considered for replacement.

This charter provision was created when the meeting schedule for the Board included eleven meetings per year. Currently, the Board holds five or six meetings annually—meaning if a seat were vacant for only two meetings in a consecutive 12-month period, it would be considered for replacement.

The 75% attendance requirement combined with the dramatically reduced number of Board meetings may raise issues for active Board members who, for valid reasons, miss two meetings in one year. At the same time, the Board is committed to holding interests accountable for their responsibilities as Board members.

To address this issue, the Board will implement the following process:

 If a seat is vacant for two unexcused meetings in a year, the interest will be contacted by the Board's Chair to determine the interest's continuing commitment to participation on the Board. An excused meeting will be defined as notification of the Chair or public involvement staff of one of the agencies to inform the Board of a member's inability to attend.
