EMSL welcomes Teller as Associate Director

On August 18, Dr. Raymond Teller joined EMSL as the Associate Director for Scientific Resources.

In his new position, Ray is responsible for oversight of EMSL's scientific capabilities and staff. He will help establish and guide strategies for revitalizing EMSL's capabilities, achieving EMSL's scientific vision, and bolstering user outreach.

Ray previously served as Director of the Intense Pulsed Neutron Source, a Department of Energy, Office of Basic Energy Sciences-funded national user facility at Argonne National Laboratory. At IPNS, he provided oversight of 90 staff and a \$17 million budget, and he established many partnerships and collaborations within the academic community, funding agencies, industrial partners, and other international and U.S. national laboratories.

Ray received his Ph.D. in chemical crystallography from the University of Southern California in 1978. He began his association with Argonne in 1979 when he was hired as an assistant chemist after completing his postdoctoral fellowship at UCLA. In this role, he worked on time-of-flight instrumentation for the new pulsed neutron source. In 1982, Ray joined Sohio Chemical (which later became BP Chemicals), where he worked first as a bench chemist and then as manager of the analytical services and exploratory catalysis sections, before becoming Director of IPNS in 2001.

He replaces former Associate Director Gordon Anderson, who joined the Biological Separations and Mass Spectrometry within PNNL's Fundamental and Computational Sciences Directorate in August 2007.
