ATTORNEY'S FEES AND COSTS DECISION*

Petitioner, Allene Mikolyski, the natural parent and guardian ad litem of Joy Mikolyski, seeks reimbursement for her attorney's fees and costs. The Court awards the amount to which respondent has not objected.

On April 16, 2008, Ms. Mikolyski filed an application for fees and costs. In this report, petitioner requested \$22,825.00 in attorney's fees, \$348.37 in attorney's costs and \$15.00 in unpaid costs. Additionally, petitioner filed a statement of costs in compliance with General Order No. 9, stating that she incurred \$1,500.00 in litigation costs. Respondent indicated that he
