Through her lectures, presentations and teaching she has educated, expanded awareness, and advanced the professional dialogue about key topics surrounding preservation and sustainable design.

A sought-after speaker, Jean lectures frequently on preservation and green-design topics to local and national audiences, including the National Building Museum in Washington, DC. She will also be presenting at this year's Greenbuild Conference in November.
