(FOR RENEWAL, SEE 49 CFR § 107.109)

- 1. GRANTEE: (See individual authorization letter)
- 2. PURPOSE AND LIMITATION:
 - a. This special permit authorizes the transportation in commerce of certain hazardous materials in non-DOT specification cylinders not presently authorized in the 49 CFR. This special permit provides no relief from the Hazardous Materials Regulations (HMR) other than as specifically stated herein.
 - b. The safety analyses performed in development of this special permit only considered the hazards and risks associated with transportation in commerce.
 - c. Unless otherwise stated herein, this special permit consists of the special permit authorization letter issued to the grantee together with this document.
- 3. REGULATORY SYSTEM AFFECTED: 49 CFR Parts 106, 107 and 171-180.
- 4. <u>REGULATIONS FROM WHICH EXEMPTED</u>: 49 CFR, §§ 173.228(b), 173.304 (a)(1) and 173.338, in that a non-DOT specification cylinder is not authorized packaging, except as specified herein.
- 5. BASIS: This special permit is based on the application of Air Products and Chemicals, Inc. dated February 4, 2002, submitted in accordance with § 107.109.

- 7. SAFETY CONTROL MEASURES: PACKAGING - Prescribed packagings are non-DOT specification cylinders made in conformance to DOT Specification 3E1800 except they are made of monel, having water capacities not exceeding 15 ounces; and non-DOT specification cylinders made in conformance to DOT Specification 3B400 except they are made of monel. The cylinders measure approximately 4 inches in diameter by 23-3/8 inches in length, including valve protection cap, having water capacities not exceeding 5 pounds. Cylinders may not be equipped with safety relief devices of any type. The non-DOT specification cylinders manufactured to the 3E specification must be packaged in strong outside boxes.
- 8. SPECIAL PROVISIONS:

A person who is not a holder of this special permit who a. receives a package covered by this special permit may reoffer it for transportation provided no modification or change is made to the package or its contents and it is reoffered for transportation in conformance with this special permit and the HMR.

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b. A current copy of this special permit must be maintained at each facility where the package is offered or reoffered for transportation.

c. Packagings permanently marked 'DOT-E 2582', prior to October 1, 2007 may continue to be used under this special permit for the remaining service life of the packaging or until the special permit is no longer valid. Packagings marked on or after October 1, 2007 must be marked 'DOT-SP 2582'.

d. Shipping papers displaying 'DOT-E 2582' may continue to be used until October 1, 2007, provided the special permit remains valid.

e. <u>MARKING</u> - In lieu of the DOT Specification 3E or 3B marking, each cylinder must be marked "DOT-SP 2582" (See paragraph 8.c. above).

f. Transportation of Division 2.1 (flammable gases) and Division 2.3 (gases which are poisonous by inhalation) are not authorized aboard cargo vessel or aircraft unless specifically authorized in the Hazardous Materials Table (§ 172.101).

- 9. <u>MODES OF TRANSPORTATION AUTHORIZED</u>: Motor vehicle, rail freight, cargo vessel, cargo aircraft only.
- 10. <u>MODAL REQUIREMENTS</u>: A current copy of this special permit must be carried aboard each cargo vessel and aircraft used to transport the cylinders covered by this special permit. The shipper shall furnish a copy of this special permit to the air carrier before or at the time the shipment is tendered.
- 11. <u>COMPLIANCE</u>: Failure by a person to comply with any of the following may result in suspension or revocation of this special permit and penalties prescribed by the Federal hazardous materials transportation law, 49 U.S.C. 5101 <u>et seq</u>:
 - All terms and conditions prescribed in this special permit and the Hazardous Materials Regulations, 49 CFR Parts 171-180.
 - o Registration required by § 107.601 et seq., when
 applicable.

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Each "Hazmat employee" as defined in § 171.8, who performs a function subject to this special permit must receive training on the requirements and conditions of this special permit in addition to the training required by §§ 172.700 through 172.704.

No person may use or apply this special permit, including display of its number, when the special permit has expired or is otherwise no longer in effect.

Under Title VII of the Safe, Accountable, Flexible, Efficient Transportation Equity Act: A Legacy for Users (SAFETEA-LU) - 'The Hazardous Materials Safety and Security Reauthorization Act of 2005' (Pub. L. 109-59), 119 Stat. 1144 (August 10, 2005), amended the Federal hazardous materials transportation law by changing the term 'exemption' to 'special permit' and authorizes a special permit to be granted up to two years for new special permits and up to four years for renewals.

12. <u>REPORTING REQUIREMENTS</u>: Shipments or operations conducted under this exemption are subject to the Hazardous Materials Incident Reporting requirements specified in 49 CFR §§ 171.15 - Immediate notice of certain hazardous materials incidents, and 171.16 - Detailed hazardous materials incident reports. In addition, the grantee(s) of this exemption must notify the Associate Administrator for Hazardous Materials Safety, in writing, of any incident involving a package, shipment or operation conducted under terms of this exemption.
