## SENATE RESOLUTION

ENCOURAGING PARTICIPATION IN THE PURPLE RIBBON AND PURPLE ARM BAND CAMPAIGN AGAINST DOMESTIC VIOLENCE.

WHEREAS, according to the Surgeon General of the United 1 States Department of Health and Human Services, domestic 2 3 violence is a problem of epidemic proportions; and 4 WHEREAS, according to the Community Overcoming Relationship 5 6 Abuse organization, also known as CORA, a woman is abused every nine seconds, 3,000,000 to 10,000,000 children witness domestic 7 violence every year, and one in five high school females 8 experience dating violence; and 9 10 11 WHEREAS, a fact sheet prepared by the National Coalition Against Domestic Violence stated that in 1999, there were 8,013 12 13 reported cases of domestic violence in Hawaii; and 14 15 WHEREAS, the Honolulu Police Department estimates that it spends up to one-third to one-half of their work time responding 16 17 to "domestic" calls; and 18 WHEREAS, in addition to the physical and psychological 19 effects of domestic violence on the victim and the victim's 20 family, there are job-related consequences; and 21 22 23 WHEREAS, domestic violence is the number one cause of injury to women, and CORA estimates that it costs the American 24 economy between \$8,000,000,000 to \$10,000,000 in 25 absenteeism, medical costs, employee turnover, lost 26 27 productivity, and other costs; and 28 WHEREAS, the goals of the Purple Ribbon and Purple Arm Band 29 30 Campaign are to urge men to show their support for: 31 32 (1)Ending men's violence against women; 33 Raising awareness of the problem in the community; 34 (2)35

(3) Conducting educational work in schools, workplaces, 1 - and communities; and 2 3 Supporting organizations that assist with the (4) 4 5 consequences of violence against women; and 6 WHEREAS, wearing a purple ribbon and purple arm band is a 7 statement that an individual will never commit, condone, nor 8 9 remain silent about violence against women; and 10 11 WHEREAS, wearing a purple ribbon and purple arm band encourages reflection and discussion that will lead to personal 12 13 and collective action among men to stop violence against women; now, therefore, 14 15 BE IT RESOLVED by the Senate of the Twenty-fourth 16 Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2008, 17 that the Legislature encourages participation in the Purple 18 19 Ribbon and Purple Arm Band Campaign against domestic violence; 20 and 21 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this 22 Resolution be transmitted to the Executive Director of the 23 Hawaii State Coalition Against Domestic Violence. 24
