SUMMARY: Notice is hereby given that the U.S. International Trade Commission has determined to extend the deadline for determining whether to review the presiding administrative law judge's ("ALJ") final initial determination ("ID") finding no violation.

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION: The Commission instituted this investigation on November 25, 2005, based on a complaint filed by Hynix Semiconductor Inc. of Korea; Hynix Semiconductor America Inc. of San Jose, California; and Hynix Semiconductor Manufacturing America Inc. of Eugene, Oregon (collectively, "Hynix"). The complaint, as supplemented and amended, alleged violations of section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930 (19 U.S.C. § 1337) in the importation into the United States, the sale for importation, and the sale within the United States after importation of certain NAND flash memory devices and products containing the same by reason of infringement of certain claims of United States Patent Nos. 5,509,995 and 5,869,404. On November 20, 2006, the presiding ALJ issued his final ID, finding no violation of section 337 by respondents Toshiba Corporation of Japan; Toshiba America Electronic Components, Inc. of Irvine, California; Toshiba America Information Systems, Inc. of Irvine, California; and Toshiba America Consumer Products, L.L.C. of Wayne, New Jersey (collectively, "Toshiba").

On November 22, 2006, Hynix requested an extension of three business days to file its petition for review of the ALJ's ID. Toshiba opposed Hynix's motion, but requested that, if the motion is granted, all of the parties receive an extension of time to file their petitions and that the Chairman extend the period for reply. On November 28, 2006, the Chairman extended the deadline for the parties to file their petitions for review by three business days and the deadline to file their replies by one business day.

The Commission has determined to extend the deadline for determining whether to review the subject ID by six (6) days to January 11, 2007.

The authority for the Commission's determination is contained in section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended (19 U.S.C. § 1337), and in section 210.42(h) of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure (19 C.F.R. § 210.42(h)).
