SUMMARY: Notice is hereby given that the U.S. International Trade Commission has determined not to review the presiding administrative law judge's ("ALJ") initial determination ("ID") (Order No. 11) extending the target date in the above-referenced investigation by 30 days from July 21, 2008 to August 20, 2008.

SUPPLEMENTARY INFORMATION: The Commission instituted this investigation on February 21, 2007, based on a complaint filed by St. Clair Intellectual Property Consultants, Inc. The complaint alleges violations of section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930 (19 U.S.C. § 1337) in the importation into the United States, the sale for importation, and the sale within the United States after importation of certain digital cameras and component parts thereof by reason of infringement of various claims of five United States patents. The complaint names Eastman Kodak Company as respondent.

On February 14, 2008, the parties filed a joint status report indicating that the California state court action between them concerning ownership of the asserted patents has been settled, and that the parties signed a binding memorandum of understanding. The parties indicated that the memorandum provides for the resolution of all claims between the parties, including the claims asserted in this investigation. The parties requested that the investigation remain stayed until they can submit a further status report to inform the ALJ of any subsequent developments when the settlement and licensing agreements are finalized.

On February 19, 2008, the ALJ extended the target date by two months to July 21, 2008, making the final ID due on March 21, 2008. On March 14, 2008, complainant moved to extend the target date, indicating that the parties required additional time to finalize the settlement documents. On March 17, 2008, the ALJ issued the subject ID, extending the target date by 30 days to August 20, 2008, making the final ID due on April 21, 2008. No petitions for review of this ID were filed.

The Commission has determined not to review the ID.

The authority for the Commission's determination is contained in section 337 of the Tariff Act of 1930, as amended (19 U.S.C. § 1337), and in section 210.42 of the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure (19 C.F.R. § 210.42).
