# INTRODUCTORY COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

The **Seeking Employment** course is a "back to basics" course designed to introduce novice ethics officials to the seeking employment rules, as well as key terms and concepts used in the rule.

The Post Employment Course provides both an overview of the

post-employment statute, 18 U.S.C. § 207, as well as a step-by-step methodology for analyzing post-employment situations.

The **Misuse of Position** course provides a broad overview of Subpart G of the Standards of Conduct and includes a four-step approach to determine whether proposed actions are prohibited by the misuse subpart.

The Widely Attended Gatherings (WAG) and Other Events Gift Exceptions course more closely examines the requirements of the speaking and similar engagement and widely attended gatherings gift exceptions.
