This letter is to advise you that a releasability determination regarding NASA contract NNC07CA01C including attachments A, B and C to the contract has been made. This determination has taken into consideration the relevant statutes, case law, and guidance, as well as comments received from the submitter of that information and the Contracting Officer. Accordingly, it is my decision to partially deny your request. The basis for this partial denial is set forth below.

Attachments A, B and C are releasable in full. However, the following information listed in the contract has been identified as exempt from release under Exemption 4 of the FOIA, 5 U.S.C § 552(b):

Contract – NNC07CA01C:

- Page B-2, Clause B.3 entitled "Estimated Cost and Fixed Fee". The dollar amounts listed in paragraph (a) for the estimated cost for CLIN 1 and the fixed fee.
- Page B-2, Clause B.4 entitled "Contract Funding". The dollar amounts listed in paragraphs (a) and (b).
- Page H-5, Clause H.5 entitled "Additional Task Order Procedures"; the task order pricing rate chart. The rates listed in each column for FY2007, FY2008 and FY2009.

The information identified above is exempt from release under Exemption 4 of the FOIA as "commercial and financial information, and obtained from a person, as privileged or confidential." This information reveals the unique methods, procedures, and/or techniques employed by the contractor to accomplish the contract, and therefore, is considered to be confidential. The initial determination has been made that the information is exempt from release under the Freedom of Information Act, 5 U.S.C. § 552(b)(4).

In order to properly and effectively conduct procurements, it is necessary for the Government to obtain detailed technical, financial, and commercial data. Only through evaluation of complete

and accurate data of this type can the Government hope to negotiate an agreement that best meets its requirements, both cost and technical. It is mandatory that the federal procurement

process be handled in a manner that fosters and promotes uninhibited transmission of confidential material. In short, public disclosure of this information would undermine the integrity of the federal procurement process.

In addition to protecting the Government's ability to obtain necessary information, exemption (b)(4) protects the competitive position of submitters. Disclosure of the requested information could cause substantial competitive injury to submitters because it would reveal insights into their business practices. Again, public disclosure of this information would undermine the integrity of the federal procurement process.

Street SW, Washington, DC 20546; (2) be clearly identified on the envelope and in the letter as an "Appeal under the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA)"; (3) include a copy of the request for the Agency record and a copy of this initial determination; (4) to the extent possible, state the reasons why you believe this decision should be reversed; and (5) be sent to the Administrator within 30 calendar days of the date of the receipt of this initial determination.
