

Comparative Civilian Labor Force Statistics, 10 Countries, 1960-2007

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GENERAL NOTES

This document presents selected international labor force statistics for 10 countries: the United States, Canada, Australia, Japan, and 6 European countries. The data are adjusted to approximate U.S. concepts except for the data in table 3, which are published by the originating country.

The foreign country data adjusted to U.S. concepts are referred to as 'adjusted' in the text and as 'approximating U.S. concepts' in the tables. Likewise, the data published by national statistical agencies are referred to as 'published' in the text and as 'published by originating country' in the tables. Published data may include career military personnel and may be from administrative records and establishment surveys; adjusted data are on a civilian basis and are based mainly on labor force surveys, many of which are now continuous (i.e. covering all weeks of the year).

ADJUSTMENTS

The U.S. concepts that form the basis for the international comparisons are described below.

- Civilian noninstitutional working age population. All persons 16 years of age and older, excluding persons who are either inmates of institutions or on active duty in the military.
- Employed persons. All persons who, during the reference week, (a) worked at least 1 hour as paid employees, worked in their own business, profession, or on their own farm, or worked at least 15 hours as unpaid workers in a family-operated enterprise, and (b) all those who did not work but had jobs or businesses from which they were temporarily absent due to vacation, illness, bad weather, childcare problems, maternity or paternity leave, labor-management dispute, job training, or other family or personal reasons, regardless of whether they were paid for the time off or were seeking other jobs.
- Unemployed persons. All persons who had no employment during the reference week, were available for work, except for temporary illness, and had actively sought work during the 4-week period ending with the reference week. "Active" job search methods are those that have the potential to result in a job offer without further action on the part of the jobseeker; for example, sending a resume to an employer would be considered "active," whereas reading newspaper advertisements would not. Persons who were waiting to start a new job must have fulfilled these criteria (for 1994 onward) to be considered unemployed; however, persons who were waiting to be recalled to a job from which they had been laid off need not have been looking for work.

Foreign country data are adjusted to U.S. concepts with the following exceptions. Lower age limits are adjusted to the age at which compulsory schooling ends rather than the U.S. lower age limit of 16 (see "Population Coverage" section for exceptions). In the United States, persons on layoff are classified as unemployed because of weak job attachment; however, in some countries, persons on layoff are classified as employed because of strong job attachment. Strong job attachment is determined by national circumstances and is evidenced by, for example, payment of salary or the existence of a recall date. In addition, for some countries, no adjustment is made for deviations from U.S. concepts in the treatment of unpaid family workers and persons waiting to start a new job. Furthermore, while Australia and Japan exclude passive jobseekers from the unemployed, in accordance with the U.S. concept, Canada and the European countries do not. An adjustment is made to exclude them in Canada but not in the European countries where the phenomenon is less prevalent. These "unadjusted" differences have a negligible effect on comparisons. Finally, sectoral data are not fully comparable with U.S. definitions for some countries because data required to make adjustments are not available. The "Country Notes" section explains specific adjustments made for each country.

BREAKS IN SERIES

Various methodological changes, such as changes in national data sources and Bureau of Labor Statistics (BLS) adjustment methods, have created breaks in the historical continuity of series for all countries except Japan. An asterisk (*) appears next to the first year that contains data affected by the change, indicating a break in series in that year. Some breaks have little or no effect on data and are therefore relatively inconsequential, while others affect comparability over time. The "Country Notes" section provides background for each country's breaks in series and measures the impact when overlapping data are available.

POPULATION COVERAGE

Data refer to the civilian noninstitutional working-age population except for Japan and Germany, where the institutional population is included. The lower age limit is 16 for the United States; the lower age limits for the foreign countries are shown in table A. Data are adjusted to the age at which compulsory schooling ends for each country except for Canada and the Netherlands. For Canada, adjusted data cover persons ages 16 and over for 1976 onward, whereas the age at which compulsory schooling ends remains at 15. For the Netherlands, adjusted data cover persons ages 15 and over for 1975 onward, although the age at which compulsory schooling ends is now 16.

For some countries, published data have an upper age limit. BLS adjusts for this divergence from the U.S. concept; therefore, the adjusted data have no upper age limit.

INDUSTRY CLASSIFICATION

For the United States and Canada, sectoral data are classified using the North American Industry Classification System (NAICS), which was developed by the statistical agencies of the United States, Canada and Mexico. Data are based on the 2002 NAICS for the United States for 2000 onward and Canada for 1976 onward; effects of the change in classification system are discussed in the "Country Notes" section. For all other countries covered, sectoral data are based on the International Standard Industrial Classification (ISIC).

OTHER COMPARATIVE SERIES

Four organizations compile internationally comparable annual series of unemployment rates for selected countries:

- The BLS publishes unemployment rates adjusted to U.S. concepts, as described in this document.
- The International Labor Organization (ILO) publishes ILO-comparable unemployment rates for 30 countries. The rates are based on ILO concepts, which are broader than U.S. concepts.
- The Statistical Office of the European Communities (EUROSTAT) publishes harmonized unemployment rates based on its own interpretation of ILO concepts for European Union countries. Since 1992, EUROSTAT concepts are similar to U.S. concepts, but some differences remain.
- The Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development (OECD) publishes "Standardized Unemployment Rates" (SURs) based on its own interpretation of ILO concepts for 27 member countries. For 1983 onward, OECD uses EUROSTAT's harmonized unemployment rates for European Union countries. Monthly updates to the SURs are available on the Internet at <http://www.oecd.org/statistics/news-releases>.

Table B compares the unemployment rates published by BLS to those published by OECD for the past three years.

ACKNOWLEDGMENTS

Data in this document are based on figures from national statistical agencies, OECD, and EUROSTAT.

COUNTRY NOTES

The following notes by country describe data sources, adjustments (except for age limits, which are indicated in the "Population Coverage" section of the "General Notes" above), and breaks in series.

UNITED STATES

Published and adjusted unemployment rates are from a monthly labor force survey called the Current Population Survey (CPS).

Adjustments. None.

Breaks. While current survey concepts and methods are very similar to those introduced at the inception of the CPS in 1940, various changes have been made over the years to improve the accuracy and usefulness of the data. These methodological changes and others, such as the introduction of new population controls from the decennial censuses, have caused many breaks in series, most of which had only a small impact on the comparability of data; however, the 1994 and 1990 breaks in series reflect major changes in methodology and are the first to be discussed below.

The 1994 break reflects a major redesign of the labor force survey questionnaire and its methodology. The redesign raised the unemployment rate by 0.1 percentage point in 1994. The 1990 break reflects the introduction of the 1990 census-based population controls, which raised the unemployment rate by 0.1 percentage point in 1990; the female labor force participation rate and employment-population ratio are not affected by this break.

The 2004, 2003, 2000, 1999, 1998, 1997, 1986, 1972, and 1962 breaks also reflect revised population controls, although the impacts of these breaks are negligible; rates are not affected by these breaks, unemployment levels are not affected by the breaks prior to 1997, and working-age population is not affected by the 1998 break. Additionally, there is a small break for employment and labor force levels in 1978, which reflects the introduction of an expansion in the sample and revisions in the estimation procedures. Sectoral data are based on the 2002 NAICS for 2000 onward; data are based on the 1987 Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) system for prior years. The change in classification system caused a break in 2000 and reduced employment in all sectors except services for 2000-02. The share of employment in agriculture decreased from 2.6 to 1.8 percent; in industry, from 22.2 to 22.0 percent; and in manufacturing (a subsector of industry), from 14.8 to 14.4 percent. Employment in services increased from 75.2 to 76.2 percent.

CANADA

Published unemployment rates are from a monthly labor force survey.

Adjustments. Adjusted data are based on labor force survey statistics. For 1976 onward, BLS adjusts unemployment data to:

- Include full-time students looking for full-time work.
- Exclude passive jobseekers.
- Exclude persons unavailable for work due to personal or family responsibilities.
- Exclude persons waiting to start a new job who did not seek work in the past 4 weeks (since 1994 only, since these persons are similarly counted among the unemployed in the United States for prior years).

Statistics Canada provides BLS with the adjusted data for 1976 onward. The adjustments have had a consistently large impact over time, reducing the annual average unemployment rate by 0.7-0.8 percentage point in the 2000s, by 0.4-0.9 percentage point in the 1990s, and by 0.2-0.4 percentage point in the 1980s. Sectoral data are not adjusted to U.S. concepts; employment for all sectors corresponds with published employment.

Breaks. For all series, there is a break in 1976, which reflects the incorporation of the 2001 Population Census results for 1976 onward. For the adjusted series, the 1976 break also reflects the implementation of the adjustments described above.

For the published series, there is an additional break in 1966, which reflects a change in labor force definitions.

For the adjusted unemployment series, there is an additional break in 1994 that is parallel to a change in U.S. definitions. This break reflects the reclassification of persons waiting to start a new job from unemployed to not in the labor force, unless they actively sought work in the past 4 weeks.

Sectoral data are shown on the 2002 NAICS for 1976 onward. These data are also benchmarked to the 2001 Population Census results. Prior to 1976, data are shown on the Canadian SIC basis. The change in classification system, which created a break in the sectoral employment series in 1976, reduced the share of employment in manufacturing from 15.7 to 15.0 percent in 1998.

AUSTRALIA

Published and adjusted unemployment rates are from a monthly labor force survey that was quarterly for 1964-77.

Adjustments. None. The unemployment rate is virtually unchanged when it is adjusted to U.S. concepts.

Breaks. For all series, there is a break in 1986. In April 2001, the Australian labor force survey questionnaire was redesigned to adhere more closely to ILO guidelines; data were revised for April 1986 onward, creating a break in 1986. The redesign reduced the unemployment rate by 0.2 percentage point in 1986.

For the unemployment series, there are breaks in 2001 and 1964. The 2001 break reflects the reclassification of persons waiting to start a new job from not in the labor force to unemployed. The reclassification raised the adjusted unemployment rate by 0.1 percentage point in 2001. The 1964 break reflects a change in sources: unemployment rates are estimated by an Australian researcher for 1960-63 and are from the Australian Bureau of Statistics for 1964 onward. JAPAN

Published unemployment rates are from a monthly labor force survey. Career military personnel are included.

Adjustments. Adjusted data are based on labor force survey statistics. BLS adjusts employment and labor force data to:

- Exclude unpaid family workers who worked less than 15 hours per week.
- Exclude career military.

Rates for 2001 onward are updated and provided to BLS by Mr. Yamagami.

Breaks. None.

FRANCE

Published unemployment rates are based on monthly employment office registrations, quarterly establishment surveys, and a continuous labor force survey that was annual prior to 2003. Career military personnel are included.

Adjustments. Adjusted data are based on labor force survey statistics. BLS adjusts employment and labor force data to exclude the military.

Sectoral data are only partially adjusted to U.S. concepts prior to 1990; employment for all sectors differs from adjusted employment and published employment.

Breaks. For the published series, there are breaks in 1975 and 1968. The 1975 break reflects an improvement in France's National Institute of Statistics and Economic Studies (INSEE) estimation methods. The 1968 break reflects a change in source: data are from OECD for 1960-68 and INSEE for 1968 onward.

For the adjusted series, there are breaks in 1990 and 1982; working-age population is not affected by these breaks. The 1990 break reflects the incorporation of 1999 Population Census results for 1990 onward. In addition, the source of the adjusted unemployment series changed: data are from OECD prior to 1990 and EUROSTAT for 1990 onward. The change in source reduced the unemployment rate by 0.5 percentage point in 1990. The 1982 break reflects the introduction of a new questionnaire and the implementation of definitions recommended by the ILO.

GERMANY

Published unemployment rates are based on registered unemployment and wage and salary workers from an establishment survey.

Adjustments. Adjusted data are based on labor force survey statistics. BLS adjusts employment and labor force data to:

- Exclude unpaid family workers who worked less than 15 hours per week prior to 1991.
- Exclude career military.

Sectoral data are only partially adjusted to U.S. concepts prior to 1991; employment for all sectors differs from adjusted employment and published employment.

Breaks. For all series there is a break in 1991, which reflects the inclusion of former East Germany. Data for 1991 onward are for Germany (unified); prior to 1991, data are for West Germany. The unification raised the adjusted unemployment rate from 4.3 to 5.6 percent in 1991.

For the published unemployment series, there is a break in 2005, which reflects a change in national legislation that broadened coverage of the registered unemployed.

For the adjusted series, there are breaks in 2005, 1999, and 1983; sectoral data are not affected by the 1983 break. The 2005 break reflects a change in the periodicity of the German labor force survey data collection. For 2005 onward, data are collected continuously; prior to 2005, data were collected in April of each year. The 1999 break reflects the incorporation of an improved method of data calculation and a change in coverage to persons living in private households only. The 1983 break reflects a change in source: data are from the German Federal Statistical Office prior to 1999 and EUROSTAT for 1999 onward. The change in source reduced the adjusted unemployment rate from 7.2 to 6.9 percent in 1983.

ITALY

Published unemployment rates are from a continuous labor force survey that was quarterly prior to 2004. Career military personnel are included.

Adjustments. Adjusted data are based on labor force survey statistics. BLS adjusts employment and labor force data to:

- Exclude unpaid family workers who worked less than 15 hours per week.
- Exclude career military.

Breaks. For all series, there are breaks in 1993, 1991, and 1986; sectoral data are not affected by the 1986 break. In 2004, Italy's labor force survey became continuous and Italy's National Institute of Statistics (ISTAT) revised its definitions to more closely follow ILO and EUROSTAT recommendations; data were revised back to 1993, causing a break in that year. The revisions raised the unemployment rate by approximately 0.5 percentage point in 1993. The 1991 break reflects a revision in the method of weighting sample data, which raised the adjusted unemployment rate from 6.6 to 6.9 percent in 1991. The 1986 break reflects a revision in the survey questionnaire, resulting in a significant increase in the number of people reported as seeking work in the past 30 days. This revision raised the adjusted Italian unemployment rate from 6.3 to 7.5 percent in 1986.

NETHERLANDS

Published unemployment rates are based on a combination of registered unemployment, wage and salary workers from an establishment survey, and a continuous labor force survey that was biennial for 1973-85.

Adjustments. Adjusted data are based on labor force survey statistics. BLS adjusts employment and labor force data to:

- Exclude unpaid family workers who worked less than 15 hours per week.
- Exclude military.

Sectoral data are only partially adjusted to U.S. concepts prior to 1987; employment for all sectors differs from adjusted employment and published employment.

Breaks. For the published series, there are breaks in 1996 and 1970. The 1996 break reflects updated population controls. The 1970 break reflects a change in source: data are from administrative records and OECD prior to 1996 and are Dutch estimates based on administrative and labor force survey data for 1996 onward.

For the adjusted series, there are breaks in 2000, 1992, 1987, and 1983; civilian working-age population is not affected by the 1992 break and sectoral data are not affected by the 1983 break. The 2000, 1987, and 1983 breaks reflect changes in sources. Prior to 1983, data are from Statistics Netherlands; for 1984-86, EUROSTAT; for 1987-2000, OECD; and for 2000 onward, EUROSTAT. For sectoral data, the 1987 break reflects the implementation of a continuous labor force survey in that year rather than a change in source. The 1992 break reflects a change in labor force definitions.

SWEDEN

Published unemployment rates are based on a continuous labor force survey that was monthly for 1970-92 and quarterly for 1961-69. Career military personnel are included.

Adjustments. Adjusted data are based on labor force survey statistics. For 1987 onward, BLS adjusts unemployment data to include full-time students who are both seeking work and available for work; this group is classified as not in the labor force by Statistics Sweden. In addition, BLS adjusts employment and labor force data to exclude the career military for all years.

Breaks. For all series, there are breaks in 2005 and 1987; working-age population is not affected by the 1987 break. The 2005 break reflects the introduction of a new questionnaire that more closely harmonizes Sweden's concepts and definitions with those of the European Union's regulatory framework.

There are several reasons for the 1987 break. First, a new questionnaire was introduced in that year. Questions regarding availability for work were added and the period of active work-seeking was reduced from 60 days to 4 weeks. These changes reduced the unemployment rate by 0.4 percentage point in 1987. Second, Statistics Sweden implemented new estimation procedures and a new reference week system in 1993. These revisions were implemented for 1987 onward, which raised the unemployment rate by 0.2-0.5 percentage point for 1987-93. Third, for the adjusted series, the break additionally reflects the classification of students seeking work as unemployed rather than not in the labor force for 1987 onward. This adjustment raised the unemployment rate by 0.1 percentage point in 1987 and by 1.0 to 2.2 percentage points for 1993 onward. While the effect of the adjustment was relatively small in earlier years, it has been larger in recent years because overall unemployment has been higher.

For the published series, there is an additional break in 1986, which reflects a change in population coverage from 16-74 years to 16-64 years.

UNITED KINGDOM

For 1971 onward, published unemployment rates are based on estimates from the United Kingdom's Office for National Statistics (ONS) as well as a continuous labor force survey that was annual for 1984-91 and biennial for 1979-83. Prior to 1971, unemployment data are the registered unemployed figures reported by the former Department of Employment and employment is based on quarterly counts of National Insurance cards. For all years, career military personnel are included.

Adjustments. Adjusted data are based on labor force survey statistics for 1971 onward, and for prior years, on a combination of sources including Population Census and Sample Census statistics. BLS adjusts employment and labor force data to exclude the career military.

Sectoral data are only partially adjusted to U.S. concepts; employment for all sectors differs from adjusted employment and published employment.

Breaks. For all series, there is a break in 1971, which reflects the incorporation of a new historical series for 1971-91. The 1971-91 series, based on administrative and labor force survey data, was created by ONS to be consistent with the series for 1992 onward. Data now comply with the current ILO definition of unemployment for 1971 onward. Sectoral data were not revised by ONS to be consistent with the series for 1992 onward because the relatively small sample size would have led to large standard errors in the model; therefore, breaks in the sectoral employment series remain as they were prior to the revision of other labor force data series. There are breaks in 1992 and 1984, which reflect the implementation of a continuous and annual labor force survey in these years, respectively.
