Description:

In the later 19th and early 20th centuries, eugenic thinking paralleled fears of degeneration in the widespread preoccupation with the decline of Western races and cultures. This course will look at the role of scientific and especially medical "experts" in promoting both the problem of and the remedy for the decline of civilization. Our emphasis will be on the changing ideas of "otherness" as symbol and cause of degeneration, and on proposed programs for regeneration in Western European and North American cultures.

Course Requirements:

Lectures will meet Mondays and Wednesdays, 11:00-12:00 in 226 Science Center. One hour of discussion section will be scheduled (probably Friday 11:00 am). We will meet on Friday, Sept 27, at 11:00 AM to figure out sectioning details. Attendance at lecture and discussion is required. Other requirements include completion of reading and short written assignments for section, participation in discussion, a mid-term examination, a final examination, and a 10-12 page final paper.
