SILVER IN DECEMBER 2006

Average daily U.S. mine production of silver in December declined by about 3% from that in November and was down by about 2% from that in December 2005, according to data compiled by the U.S. Geological Survey. Preliminary data indicate that annual production for 2006 was about 7% lower than that for 2005 and was at the lowest level in 20 years. U.S. silver mine production has fallen by almost 48% since it reached its post-World War II peak of 2,180 metric tons in 1997.

The Engelhard Industries' price for silver averaged \$13.37 per troy ounce in December, the highest monthly level since silver prices peaked in May 2006. The annual average price for 2006 of \$11.61 per ounce of silver was 58% higher than that for 2005 and was the highest annual average since 1980, when the price reached a record-high average of more than \$20 per ounce.

On December 15, Strategic Nevada Resources Corp. (Vancouver, British Columbia, Canada) announced that it had won a public auction for the right to purchase 100% of the Crescent Mine in the Coeur d'Alene Mining District, Shoshone County, ID, for \$650,000. The company, acting on a 20-day deadline to complete its due diligence and finalize the transaction, announced on January 2, 2007, that it had completed the purchase. The Crescent Mine, which had been jointly owned by Shoshone County and the U.S. Environmental Protection (EPA) since the early 1990s, had previously operated as a high-grade silver mine. According to a report prepared by Bunker Hill Mining Company, the last operator of the mine, the mine produced 782 metric tons (t) (25.1 million troy ounces) of silver from ore averaging 960 grams per metric ton (g/t) (27 troy ounces per short ton) silver over its lifetime (1917-81). At the time of its final closure in 1983, the remaining "proven, probable and projected" resource was estimated to be about

360,000 t grading about 970 g/t (27.3 troy ounces per short ton) silver. The Crescent Mine is located between the Sunshine Mine on the east and the Bunker Hill Mine on the west. Crescent Nevada Resources believed that the Crescent Mine had near-term mining potential owing to significant existing mining, processing, and utility infrastructure. Based a greater understanding of the lithographic and structural controls of the silver veins in the District since the Crescent Mine was last operated, new development was expected to occur at shallow depths above the water table and preclude the need for pumping water and continued EPA involvement. By the end of January, the company reportedly had completed the first stage of power restoration to surface buildings, and it expected full power restoration to be accomplished by the end of April. Startup of production was anticipated by the end of 2007 (Platts Metals Week, 2006; Strategic Nevada Resources Corp., 2006; 2007 a,
