## INDUSTRY SIZE STANDARDS

(As of February 2004)

SBA defines a small business concern as one that is independently owned and operated, is organized for profit, and is not dominant in its field. Depending on the industry, size standard and eligibility is based on the average number of employees for the preceding twelve months or on sales volume averaged over a three-year period. Examples of SBA general size standards include the following:

- Wholesaling: Maximum number of employees may range from 100

to 500, depending on the particular product being

provided;

depending on the particular service being provided;

- Retailing: Annual receipts may not exceed \$6.0 to \$24.0 million

depending on the particular product being provided;

- General and General construction annual receipts may not exceed

Heavy Construction: \$12.0 to \$28.5 million, depending on the type of

Construction;

- Special Trade

Construction: Annual receipts may not exceed \$12.0 million

- Agriculture: Annual receipts may not exceed \$0.750 to \$10.5

million, depending on the agricultural product.
