 - the alteration of an aircraft flight plan or operation,
 - the release of radioactive materials from Type B packaging,
 - the release of over 11.9 gallons or 88.2 pounds of a severe marine pollutant, or
 - the release of a bulk quantity (over 119 gallons or 882 pounds) of a hazardous material.
