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REAL EARNINGS IN MAY 2002

Real average weekly earnings increased by 0.3 percent from April to May after seasonal adjustment, according to preliminary data released today by the Bureau of Labor Statistics of the U.S. Department of Labor. This was due to a 0.2 percent increase in average hourly earnings and a 0.1 percent decrease in the Consumer Price Index for Urban Wage Earners and Clerical Workers (CPI-W). Average weekly hours were unchanged.

Data on average weekly earnings are collected from the payroll reports of private nonfarm establishments. Earnings of both full-time and part-time workers holding production or nonsupervisory jobs are included. Real average weekly earnings are calculated by adjusting earnings in current dollars for changes in the CPI-W.

Average weekly earnings rose by 3.2 percent, seasonally adjusted, from May 2001 to May 2002. After deflation by the CPI-W, average weekly earnings rose by 2.4 percent. Before adjustment for seasonal change and inflation, average weekly earnings were \$500.25 in May 2002, compared with \$484.56 a year earlier.

Real Earnings for June 2002 will be released on Friday, July 19, 2002.
