


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Salmon and Trout - September 2007 - Chile





Chilean exports of salmon and trout during the first half of 2007 performed well both in volume and value and their share in total fishery exports has grown. Several problems have affected the production sector, but total production can be expected to increase further in 2007, along with changes in the species composition of production.

Growing exports

In the first semester of 2007, Chilean exports of salmon and trout totaled 276 843 tonnes worth US\$ 1 284.9 million. These levels represent a 18.7% growth in terms of volume and a 24% increase in value compared to the same period in 2006. At the same time, the value figure accounted for 63.9% of the total income from Chilean exports of fishery products. This share has grown in the last few years, as can be observed in the tables below, and the trend is the same when we compare the period between January and June in 2006 and 2007. As for the volume, the share also grew between both periods, but in the last few years the trend is not as clear as that for value. The cause is not a fall in production but a corresponding increase for other products.

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
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Nonetheless, a sustained growth of exports of salmonids can be observed in the last four years, both in volume and value terms. Between 2003 and 2006, the exported quantity grew 40.8%, and the value of sales to foreign markets had a remarkable growth of 93.9%.

Production: change in the composition and negative shocks in 2007

The annual production of salmonids in Chile has grown throughout the years, as can be observed in the chart below. In 2006, the production of the three most important species reached 643 941 tonnes, which represented a 4.8% growth when compared to the 614 144 tonnes registered in 2005. Between 1995 and 2006, Chilean production of Atlantic salmon, rainbow trout and coho salmon grew at a 14.8% average annual growth rate. The main species is Atlantic salmon (*Salmo salar*). However, recently, changes in the composition of production are evident. Atlantic salmon has experienced a reduction, and production of rainbow trout (*Onchorhynchus mykiss*) and coho salmon (*Onchorhynchus kisutch*) has increased. During the first half of 2007, compared to the same period in 2006, the changes for these three species were -9.7%, +51.3% and +68.7% respectively. The performance of production during the first semester can be observed in the dotted lines. Total production of these species in the first half of 2007 grew 11.4% compared to the same period in 2006.




During 2007, the salmon producing sector has received a series of negative shocks. The first of these was the earthquake in April in the XI Region, in the area of Aysén, causing landslides and a tsunami in the fjords. The quake and the wave caused structural damage in 14 harvest centers and one fish farm, although not all of them were operational at the time. The XI Region is a very important one for Chilean salmon production. One of the most important safety measures taken after the tremor was the restriction on navigation inside the fjords, which had a negative effect in the industry given that the fjords are a key connecting passage to the sea for the transportation of production. A proposed solution for this problem is the relocation of some aquaculture centers. Nevertheless, despite the shock of the seismic activity, exports from the Region in the first semester might not have been seriously affected, and may even have increased in terms of value, according to statements made by the Regional Director of ProChile (the export promotion office).

On another matter, several outbreaks of the ISA (Infectious Salmon Anemia) virus have been reported. This disease had never been detected before in Chile. The presence of the virus had only been detected until now in Norway, where it caused very high mortality rates, even close to 100% of salmon populations in some cases. At least 39 harvest centers had been quarantined by the end of August due to the virus. The infections caused the mortality in centers to increase between 11% and 12%, according to statements from the National Director of the National Fishing Service (SERNAPESCA). Although the infection outbreak is focused on production in the island of Chiloe, in the X Region, the Director of SERNAPESCA stated that the salmon industry has to work more intensively in health issues that appear as key conditions for future sustainability.

Main exported species and products

The main exported species is Atlantic salmon. During the first six months of 2007, exports of this species reached 101 957 tonnes worth US\$ 730 million, figures that represent 36.8% of total sales of salmonids in terms of volume, and 56.8% of the exported value. The second species is rainbow trout, with exports of 61 872 tonnes and US\$ 309.8 million (22.3% and 24.1% share of the total respectively). The third one is coho salmon, with 50 805 tonnes (18.4%) and US\$ 190.1 million (14.8%). The unit value of Chilean exports during the first semester grew 4.5% compared to the same period in 2006, led by the growth of Atlantic salmon products' prices.




value. As for the type of product, the most important presentation is fillets, with exports at US\$ 560.3 million and 75 273 tonnes, followed by whole and H&G (US\$ 425.1 million; 107 742 tonnes) and thirdly, portions and pieces (US\$ 186.9 million; 22 115 tonnes). The unit value of fillets between both periods under review grew 16.1%, and the unit value of portions and pieces grew 22.8%. The growth of the unit value of whole and H&G was lower, +4.8%.

Inside the fillets category, the main line of sales to foreign markets is fresh fillets. During the first half of the current year, sales of this item reached 38 224.7 tonnes worth US\$ 284.6 million (+9.6% and +23.7% respectively compared to 2006). A breakdown of the export figures shows that frozen whole and H&G becomes the single most important category for the period, with sales of 98 877 tonnes worth US\$ 379.6 million (+29.9% and +34.2%).

A more detailed breakdown of the export figures shows, as indicated in the chart below, that the main export product during the first half of 2007, according to values, was fresh fillets of Atlantic salmon. This item registered exports at 36 946 tonnes worth US\$ 280.8 million, which represents an increase of 7.7% in volume and 21.9% in value compared to the first half of 2006, when exports reached 34 299 tonnes worth US\$ 230.4 million. Also, these figures show a 13.1% growth in the unit value of this product. The second export product in terms of revenues is also the one that has the most significant sales in terms of quantity namely whole and H&G frozen coho salmon, with 48 177 tonnes worth US\$ 176.3 million. This category showed one of the most remarkable variations among the main export products, +38.1% in terms of volume and +42% in terms of value. The third item in importance both in volume and value is frozen whole and H&G rainbow trout. Exports during the six months period were 40 557 tonnes with values at US\$ 157.4 million (+37.6% and +42.1%).

Regarding the different products, 65% of the exported value during the first semester of 2007 is accounted for by frozen products, which in quantity account for 58% of the total (US\$ 830.4 million; 160 738 tonnes). The second main category was fresh products, with 27% of the exported value and 18% of the volume (US\$ 351 million; 48 819 tonnes). Categories with much lower shares include salmonid fishmeal and fishoil (with a 10% and 12% volume share each), smoked salmon, canned and dried and salted, which together account for the remaining 8% of total

Not surprisingly, production trends are reflected in export trends. While sales of Atlantic salmon fell 3.1% in quantity, sales of rainbow trout grew 30.9% and coho salmon sales jumped 31.8%. Atlantic salmon showed the highest unit value increase, +18% while unit values for exports of trout grew by 5.6%, and for coho salmon by 2.4%.



Export markets are highly concentrated

The main destination for Chilean exports of salmon and trout in terms of value is the US market. In the first half of 2007, 62 455 tonnes worth US\$ 467.5 million were destined for this market. This means an 8.2% increase in volume and a 22.8% increase in value. Regarding the US share of total Chilean exports of salmon and trout, it was 36.4% in value and 22.6% in volume for the period under review. It is

worth mentioning that the US market is, among the main markets, the one where Chilean products achieve the highest unit values. The main traded product is fresh Atlantic salmon fillets which accounted for 58.2% of volumes and 59.1% of values. Observing the behaviour of US imports, according to NMFS data, and taking into account the accumulated imports during the first semester (dotted lines), and the total annual results, it can be expected that Chilean exports to the US will maintain an upward trend in terms of value and volume for 2007. It is important to note that this index was elaborated as an illustration, and the information provided by the NMFS may be slightly different to that provided by Chilean customs.

Japan has the second place as main destination for Chilean exports. Trade with this country grew 22.8% in terms of volume and 23% in terms of value, from 82 760 tonnes and US\$ 341.4 million in the first semester of 2006, to 101 591 tonnes worth US\$ 419.8 million in 2007. Japan had in 2007 a 36.7% value share and a 35.5% volume share for Chilean sales of salmon and trout to foreign markets. The

main species sold to this market is rainbow trout with exports reaching 41 246 tonnes and US\$ 218.4 million between January and June 2007. The main trout product is frozen whole and H&G, which accounts for 58.9% and 42.6% of the traded volume and value, followed by frozen fillets with a share of 27.6% and 39.2% respectively.

The American and Japanese markets together account for 59.3% of total volume exports and 69.1% of value exports. It is also important to highlight the growth of sales to Russia and China. During the first six months of the current year, sales to Russia more than doubled, and a similar performance can be observed in exports to Vietnam, although this market has a much lower share. Sales to China grew strongly in both volume and value terms, +86.3% and +42% respectively.

Recent trends and outlook

The salmon industry accounted in 2006 for nearly 4% of total Chilean exports, and is becoming an increasingly important productive sector. Recently, some companies have listed shares in the stock market as a mean of obtaining funds for their expansion plans. This development is seen as very positive, not only for the dynamism that this implies for the industry, given that it is expected that other companies follow the initiative, but because it enhances transparency in the operations of the industry.

The boom in the industry has been supported by the increase in international prices, which achieved record levels. At the same time, some operators expect that these prices will decrease during the second half of the year, since a higher production of salmon in Norway is expected. Nevertheless, an increase can be expected in Chilean exports of salmon and trout, both in quantity and value, following the strong performance during the first six months of 2007.

Despite the positive outlook, some challenges remain for the Chilean salmon industry. On the one hand, the recovery of part of the productive sector affected by the earthquake in the XI Region. On the other, the industry has been the target of several environmentalist claims regarding the impact of its operations. At the same time, the industry is being affected by an increase in production costs, and also by the outbreak of several diseases, such as sea lice and the ISA virus which recently appeared for the first time in Chile. Health aspects are emerging as a key issue to be taken into account by the industry to assure its long term sustainability.


On another matter, on September 3rd, the free trade agreement between Chile and Japan came into effect. However, for the moment, the only products which will benefit from the FTA are frozen and smoked rainbow trout, while the reduction of duties for Atlantic salmon and coho salmon will be considered in five years. The import duty for frozen rainbow trout will be reduced from 3.5% to 3.2% immediately, and will be cut to zero in eleven years. The duty for smoked rainbow trout, which currently is 10%, will be cut to 1.25%, and to zero in eight years. Given that Chile is the only country which has an FTA with Japan, this should provide special advantages to enable it to compete with other countries. This agreement is a positive development for the industry, although its effects will be more noticeable in the longer term.

Trout sector in need of increased EU production

Peruvian trout producers are set to benefit from a new FAO-funded project that will introduce a management and policy alignment tool to help rationalise and develop the entire aquaculture sector. The country produced 6 883 tonnes of freshwater fish in 2006, of which trout accounted for 6163 tonnes. It is hoped that the new project will see the country become a major producer of both freshwater and coastal aquaculture species.



Japan's imports of Chilean trout from September 2006 to April 2007 were around 60000 tonnes, with fillets and other products making up 25000 tonnes of this total. Since then, trade has slowed down and prices for 4/6 lb fish have dipped from a high in May of Y580 to Y 540/kg.

There is also concern that Japanese demand for Chilean trout could be affected over the coming year by an increased supply of fresh, domestically farmed coho, whereas Chile's exports to Japan are entirely frozen. A further factor is that seafood consumption in the country is showing a declining trend, particularly among young Japanese.

The overall average unit value of Chilean trout exports to the beginning of this year was US\$5.2/kg, up 9.5% on the 2005 average of US\$4.7/kg. Whole fish increased by 12.1% to US\$3.6/kg, headed and gutted went up 6.4% to US\$4.0/kg and the value of fillets jumped 16.6% to US\$7.1/kg.

N Total exports of trout from Norway rose by 25% in the first five Months of 2007 compared with the same period in 2006. Exports to the EU doubled despite an antidumping duty of nearly 20%, which is in place for 5 years from 2004. It appears that EU producers are unable to meet consumer demand and need to step up production to do so.

O While volumes increased from 13736 to 17114 tonnes, the overall unit value dropped by -9% from NOK32.86/kg to NOK 29.97/kg. This resulted in an export market worth NOK 513 million, up 14% on the 2006 value of NOK 451 million.

R The focus of trout exports shifted significantly, with fresh and frozen exports for 2007 being nearly equal at between 8,000 - 9,000 tonnes compared with the situation in 2006. Then, fresh sector exports of 2087 tonnes made up just 15% of the 13736 total and frozen trout exports amounted to 11649 tonnes. The bulk of these changes was the result of Russian Federation buyers showing a preference for fresh product, increasing their purchases significantly from a negligible 81 tonnes in 2006 to 5335 tonnes in 2007. During the same period, Russian Federation purchases of frozen trout fell by -68% from 6005 tonnes down to 1957 tonnes.

W Exports of frozen trout to Japan also fell sharply by -31%, down from 3423 tonnes to 2347 tonnes. Taiwan and Ukraine however, increased their purchases of frozen Norwegian trout from 43 to 1293 tonnes and from 460 to 803 tonnes respectively. These rises in volume were accompanied by a decrease in the unit values, which were down -5% from NOK 31.14/kg to NOK 29.46/kg for Taiwan and down -12% from NOK 32.95/kg to NOK 28.88/kg for Ukraine.

A In the fresh sector, exports to Finland increased by 453% to 979 tonnes, on the back of a drop in unit value of -15% from €NOK31.27/kg to NOK 26.50/kg. This is due to increased demand in the country, which domestic producers are failing to keep up with.

Y While the unit value fell in both the fresh and frozen sectors, a larger fall in fresh fish prices saw them drop below the unit value of frozen fish. The average unit value for fresh fish in 2007 was NOK 29.22/kg compared with the 2006 value of NOK 33.42/kg, which was a fall of -13%. Frozen unit values fell by -6% from NOK 32.76/kg in 2006 to NOK 30.66/kg in 2007.

Germany imported a total of 2874 tonnes of trout worth €9.13 million in the first four months of 2007, which is a drop of -11% on the 2006 volume of 3246 and a -7% fall in value.

Entries into Germany from the major suppliers of fresh trout were mixed. Within this overall picture there was a -56% drop in fresh imports from 653 tonnes to 284 tonnes and a -13% fall in frozen imports from 1233 tonnes to 1070 tonnes. This was only partly compensated for by a rise of 12% in the import of live trout, up from 1360 tonnes to 1521 tonnes.

Results for Denmark were mixed. Denmark retained its position as the major supplier of fresh trout to Germany, but sales fell -54% from 223 tonnes to 104 tonnes. France, Italy and Belgium also lost sales, while Poland increased its supplies by 160% from 30 tonnes to 79 tonnes. It is notable that Polish unit values at €2.46/kg were significantly lower than the average of €3.56/kg, while Danish, Italian and Belgian supplies were priced well above the average at €4.19/kg, €3.87/kg and €4.50/kg respectively.

Market share for Spain in the frozen trout sector fell by 39% from 607 tonnes to 368 tonnes and lost ground to Denmark and Chile whose supplies grew by 46% and 16% respectively. The unit value of trout from Chile at €2.84/kg, was €0.83 lower than that imported from Spain.

Although Spain remained the major supplier of frozen trout, but Spanish exports dropped -39% from 607 tonnes to 368 tonnes and lost ground to Denmark and Chile whose supplies grew by 46% and 16% respectively. Notably, the total cost of frozen imports in 2007 was €3.69 million, a slight fall of -2% from €3.8 million in 2006. Live fish for restocking make up the major portion of German trout imports and this situation strengthened in 2007 with an increase of 12% in volume, from 1360 tonnes to 1521 tonnes, and a 12% rise in average unit values, up from €2.60/kg to €2.92/kg.

YFrance lost its position as the premier supplier of live trout, with a slight drop of -7% from 593 tonnes to 550 tonnes. The top position was taken over by Denmark, with an 11% rise from 535 tonnes to 594 tonnes. Italy and Poland also increased their share of this sector, with a rise of 32% from 152 tonnes to 201 tonnes for Italy and a 279% rise from 22 tonnes to 85 tonnes for Poland.

F The majority of French trout exports are of live fish into Germany and Belgium. Sales of these fell by -28% during the first quarter of 2007, from 1169 to 838 tonnes. This was partly compensated for by a 51% rise in the unit value from €2.43/kg to €3.68/kg and a 9% rise in sales of fresh trout from 190 tonnes to 208 tonnes.

R The result was a 2% rise in the total value of exports from €3.85 million to €3.9 million. However, overall volumes fell -24% from 1424 tonnes to 1085 tonnes.

A While the average unit value of fresh sales fell -11% from €4.01/kg to €3.56/kg, there was a marked variation in the value paid by traders. Spanish buyers paid €4.91/kg, which was an 11% increase on the value the previous year, while Swiss buyers paid an average of €1.93/kg, 11% less than the year before.

C Frozen trout make up a small part of the export picture for France, at around 4% of the total. This share fell further in 2007 with a 40% drop in volume from 65-39 tonnes and a 31% drop in unit value from €3.69/kg to €2.54/kg.

Salmon, EU - July 2007



General overview and price trends

The EU salmon market is dominated by imports of fresh, whole (gutted) products, mostly from Norway, imports of Norwegian fresh salmon representing nearly 70 percent of total EU salmon imports from non-EU countries. In January-June 2007 Norway exported 238 600 tonnes of fresh salmon to the EU (live weight), a 19 percent increase from the same period of the previous year.

As reported by the past year's issues of the European Price Report (EPR), fresh salmon prices from Norway declined from the peak of €6.00/kg in June 2006 to the current level of €3.35/kg. Despite the decline, prices are still maintaining profitable levels. However, they are expected to decline further in the coming weeks,

possibly going below the EU-imposed minimum price (MIP) of €2.80/kg.

The decline of Norwegian salmon prices can be attributed to an increasing supply: production of farmed Atlantic salmon in Norway managed to reach 600 000 tonnes in 2006. More recently, Norwegian producers marketed an increasing number of smaller (hence, cheaper) fish in order to prevent exposure to a pancreatic disease recently reported in southern Norway. This has led to smaller fish coming to market now, but could lead to an overall reduction in supplies over time (as the slaughtered fish could have reached 3 to 4 kg towards the end of the year).



France

Salmon is one of France's favourite seafood categories – in 2006, fresh salmon was the main seafood import product in the country. However French imports declined by 4 percent in the first four months of 2007 as opposed to the same period in the previous year. French supplies of salmon are dominated by whole fresh product from Norway.

On 1 May 2007, The Kritsen and Pan Fish companies, both located in the *Finistère département*, merged to give rise to Marine Harvest Kritsen. This new, salmon processing company (owned by Marine Harvest Norway, producing smoked salmon and other value-added salmon products) is expected to generate a turnover of more than €100 million in 2007, with three factories and 800 employees. It will rank first or second on the salmon market in France.

The French salmon market relies on the presence of strong brands and on a high degree of product diversification (wide range of pack weights, organic salmon, quality labels, smoked salmon cubes etc.). The recent Kritsen-Pan Fish merging is expected to lead to further innovations and stronger brands.

Germany

German salmon imports declined, in quantity terms, from 22 500 tonnes in January-March 2006 to 21 700 tonnes in January-March 2007. However, in value terms, they increased from €112.9 million to €121.8 million in the same period. The increase in average unit values reflected an increase in imports of salmon fillets from Chile.

Box 1: Chile growing as an EU supplier of salmon

The traditional export markets for Chilean salmon are the United States and Japan, but its market share of the EU is growing. EU imports of salmonoids (including trout) from Chile, mostly composed of frozen fillets, increased from approximately 23 400 tonnes in 2002 to nearly 50 000 tonnes in 2005 and 2006. In January-March 2007, exports of salmonoids increased to 12 000 tonnes from slightly more than 10 000 tonnes in the same period of the previous year. Germany is the main EU market for Chilean salmon.

The Chilean salmon industry shares some characteristics with the Norwegian industry but there are also many differences. In terms of ownership structure and concentration the Chilean industry is more concentrated and many of the salmon companies are part of larger industrial holdings engaged in a number of unrelated activities. Also geographically, Chile's industry is more concentrated with most salmon operations taking part in region 10 (*Los Lagos*). This leads to economies of scale in production and in access to services. However, the heavy geographical concentration is also risky because of the danger of diseases spreading to neighbouring farms. Several health and safety issues, aggravated by geographic concentration, made production stagnant from 2001. The recent outbreak of the salmon lice disease resulted in zero production growth in 2006 as opposed to 2005 levels, despite analysts' projections of 15 percent growth formulated in the earlier part of the year.

As opposed to Norwegian salmon production, more species (Coho salmon, rainbow trout) rather than just Atlantic salmon enter the Chilean product mix. Furthermore, the degree of processing is higher in the Chilean sector because of the lower cost of the Chilean workforce and the higher use of aircargo for fresh fillets, hence the dominant position of fillets in the export mix.

Germany is the main importer of smoked salmon within the EU, with 4 400 tonnes imported in January-March 2007. The main supplier of smoked salmon to Germany is Poland. Imports of smoked salmon from Poland are expected to increase further in the months after May 2007, when the German

salmon processing company Laschinger was taken over by the Polish Morpol. With two production plants in Poland and one in Germany, jointly processing approximately 60 000 tonnes of fish per year, Morpol and Laschinger are expected to generate a turnover of approximately €300 million.

Box 2: Poland.

Poland has recently emerged as a major importer of fresh salmon and exporter of smoked salmon. The relocation of German and Danish smokehouses turned salmon-smoking in Poland into a state-of-the-art activity. Polish imports of fresh salmon, mainly from Norway, increased from less than 25 000 tonnes in 2004 to nearly 50 000 tonnes in 2006. The raw material is then smoked and re-exported, mainly to Germany (and, to a lesser extent, to Denmark and Italy). Polish exports of smoked salmon increased from slightly more than 8 000 tonnes in 2004 to more than 20 000 tonnes in 2007.

German consumers are traditionally believed to be price-conscious. However, they are also willing to pay premium prices for environmentally and socially responsible purchases. The market for organic salmon in Germany is growing rapidly and the Marine Stewardship Council's eco-labelled wild salmon from Alaska is currently being marketed by Lidl, one of the largest retail chains in Europe.

Italy

Consumption of salmon in Italy is rather low as opposed to other fish species, and compared to other markets as the Italian consumer continues to prefer whitefish from the Mediterranean (such as seabass and seabream) to coldwater fish species. Furthermore, whilst most fish species are traditionally consumed mainly in the summer, in southern Italy and along the coast¹, salmon is mainly consumed in the north and in big cities. Finally, smoked salmon on toast is one of the favourite hors-d'oeuvre at the Christmas Eve dinner in Italian homes.

Italian imports of salmon are mainly represented by whole gutted fresh product, even if considerable quantities are also traded in smoked and filleted form. In fact, up to 2004 Italy used to be the main importer of smoked salmon within the EU, but its leading role was taken over by Germany in 2005. The reason for this was that the Italian smoking capacity is low and therefore consumption relies on

imports of smoked products, and that Germany now has outsourced most of its processing. The main supplier of (mainly fresh) salmon to Italy is Norway (through Denmark and Sweden). Denmark is the second biggest supplier of smoked salmon to Italy after France, mostly based on Norwegian raw material. Approximately 1 000 tonnes of smoked salmon per year are produced domestically in Italy, against 7 000 imported tonnes per year. Domestic production is mostly aimed at the top end retail segment such as luxury delicatessen shops and up-scale supermarkets.

Spain

Spanish salmon imports (mainly consisting in fresh whole product) declined by 4 percent in volume and 3 percent in value in January-March 2007 as opposed to the same period in 2006. The Spanish market is quite similar to the Italian one in terms of its conservativeness and preference for unprocessed Mediterranean whitefish. Only in March this year, some smoked salmon-based ready-meals have been launched for the first time by the Spanish smoked fish and cod specialist Copesco & Sefrisa.

Outlook

At present, the EU market is currently well supplied with increasingly cheaper fresh salmon from Norway. Should the MIP price be enforced against Norwegian suppliers, they are expected to find it more expensive to enter the EU market in the coming months, because of the punitive duty applied when prices would fall below the MIP level. This situation would favour Chile and especially EU suppliers such as the UK or Ireland. The latter supply the EU market with a product which is sometimes perceived as of a better quality yet more expensive than Chilean and Norwegian products. Therefore, EU consumers may face the prospect of paying artificially higher prices if they want to purchase salmon.

Even if the MIP is aimed at protecting EU salmon producers, its removal may not necessarily mean the end of the EU salmon industry, which in any case is now mostly owned by Norwegian companies. In fact, as the French market shows, the range of salmon products is becoming increasingly

diversified, therefore maintaining the niche for upmarket salmon and salmon preparations from EU countries as well as eco-labelled wild salmon, value-added products, fillets, smoked salmon and canned salmon.

In 2007, production of salmon in Norway is projected to increase from 2006 levels, possibly slowing down in the end of the year due to the current premature slaughtering of young fish (which would have reached 3-4 kg each around Christmas). Should the Chilean authorities be able to tackle effectively the lice disease, Chilean production would be projected to increase by 7 to 10 percent from 2006 levels.

Norway: double the money investing in salmon

According to the to a 20-page report made by Norwegian stockbroker firm Pareto, the operating margin (*EBITDA, Earnings Before Interest, Taxes, Depreciation and Amortization*) is four times higher in the salmon industry than what it is for comparable protein producers. The salmon industry is a fast growing one while the production of animal proteins has a very slow growth rate. Since 1990 production of farmed salmon has been growing at an average 10 per cent annually. Global salmon consumption stands at around 2.5 million tonnes, of which 60 per cent is farmed salmon. Large companies in the wild salmon sector have now invested in salmon farms. The conclusions of the report seem to point to investing in salmon shares to double the investor's money.



Russia stops Chilean salmon imports, imports of salmon from Norway recovering


Russia has ordered a halt to seafood imports from a number of Chile-based companies over alleged paperwork falsification. Behind the ban are the same veterinary authorities that in 2006 placed an import ban on Norwegian salmon. The two countries are working to introduce a new system that will make it harder to falsify certificates and other documents. The Chilean trade attaché invited Russian inspectors to examine the Chilean salmon industry. The Russians are keen to learn how Chilean salmon farmers run their operations, and to familiarize themselves with value-added processing and transporters in that country.

Russian imports of salmon from Norway declined from 54 300 tonnes in 2005 to 37 500 tonnes in 2006 (live weight figures), due to a partial import ban enforced from early 2006 on health and safety grounds, as Russian inspectors claimed to have found residues of heavy metals in Norwegian salmon consignments. As the ban was lifted for a larger number of companies, imports of Norwegian salmon started increasing again: in January-June 2007, they reached 24 600 tonnes as opposed to 14 600 tonnes imported in the same period of the previous year. Interestingly, the 2006 ban on salmon imports was accompanied by an increase of Russian imports of *Pangasius* catfish from Vietnam, which reached 42 800 tonnes in 2006 against the mere 3 000 tonnes imported in 2005.




Salmon Production




Salmon Imports








Salmon Exports


