

Wang Appointed to Editorial Advisory Board

Lai-Sheng Wang, a long-time user of the U.S. Department of Energy's Environmental Molecular Sciences Laboratory, was appointed to the 2008 Editorial Advisory Board of *The Journal of Physical Chemistry*.

A professor at Washington State University Tri-Cities and an Affiliate Senior Chief Scientist at Pacific Northwest National Laboratory, Wang was selected for the three-year term on board based on his distinguished and innovative contributions to the field of atomic clusters and for pioneering work on gaseous multiply-charged anions. In this role, Wang will influence the current policies and future direction of this publication. Produced weekly by the American Chemical Society, the journal is actually three highly respected journals focused on different aspects of experimental and theoretical research of interest to physical chemists and chemical physicists.
