Welcome PHRC Volunteers!

Last fall Public Health Seattle & King County (PHSKC) launched the Public Health Reserve Corps; a group of volunteers prescreened and trained to augment Public Health staff during an emergency in King County. When every minute counts, the Public Health Reserve Corps will play a major role.

The primary areas of focus for the PHRC are:

- Dispensing medications and vaccinations
- Conducting health screening & assessment

As Public Health increases its capability to respond to emergencies, the PHRC will also expand in scope and size.
Successfully, our initial recruitment brought in over 120 volunteers

which includes pharmacists, pharmacy technicians, advanced registered nurse practitioners, licensed practical nurses, physicians, and support volunteers.

The PHRC is supported through the Cities Readiness Initiative (CRI), a CDC pilot program that aids cities in increasing their capacity to quickly deliver medicines to local communities during a large-scale public health emergency.

We appreciate your support and patience as we continue to develop and improve our application and screening process.

We look forward to meeting and working with each of you. Thank you for your dedication and support.
