- 1. Page 6, Line 3: Change the dash to a hyphen.
- Page 6, Line 11: Delete the word "therefore" from the first sentence, beginning it with "Because."
- 3. Delete Footnote 3 on Page 4.

- 5. Return the draft Advisory Opinion to the Office of General Counsel to redraft and recirculate on a tally vote basis.
