Quarter Explorer - We are very excited to announce the arrival of our newest game, Quarter Explorer! Students will march down Main Street in Bison City, USA, completing tasks in order to earn Bill the Mint Buffalo enough quarters to go on a trip across the country. Students will use their knowledge of United States geography and the 50 State Quarters® Program in order to complete the tasks and earn quarters. The more quarters your students receive, the nicer Bill's trip will be!



<u>Birth of a Coin</u> – As you probably already know, this cartoon allows students to witness, step-by-step, how coins are designed and minted. Now, you can download the <u>Acrobat storybook version</u> to print out and use in your classroom!



<u>December's Coin of the Month</u> – The 1937 Roanoke Island, North Carolina, half dollar is December's Coin of the Month. Join Goldie the Mint Fish as she explores the mystery surrounding the disappearance of the Roanoke Island settlement in 1587. Maybe you will be able to uncover what exactly happened to the "Lost Colony"!

New Nickels – The familiar nickel design will undergo a bit of a change in 2004. The new nickels will commemorate the 200<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Thomas Jefferson's Louisiana Purchase and Lewis and Clark's famous Corps of Discovery. Have students see and read about the two new nickel reverse designs to be released in 2004. It's a great way to show students that coins really are History In Your Pocket!
