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
What is Potential for CHP in the federal sector?

- Assessment of CHP potential at Federal sites (Feb. 2002)
- Based on:
 - GSA federal building database
 - EIA-CBECS energy intensities
 - EIA Year 2000 industrial energy rates
 - CHP system cost and O&M data
 - Tech-specific performance assumptions





Federal CHP Potential Nation-Wide: 1500-1600 MW (Base case engines or turbines with payback <10 yrs)



FEMP Market Assessment: 1500 MW Federal CHP Potential =

- \$170 million/year in energy cost savings
- Avg. return on investment <8 years
- 50 trillion Btu/yr of source energy savings
- 4 million metric tons/yr of avoided CO2
- Increase reliability/security representing 13% of total federal electricity purchased (in 2000)

e.g. this is significant!


California's Share: Estimated 336 MW of CHP Potential

- Prime candidates include
 - R&D facilities, sites with central plants
 - Hospitals
 - Energy-intensive service facilities and
 - Office buildings paying commercial rates
- Average simple return on investment under 7 years





California CHP Potential: Navy and Air Force represent half of total (336 MW)
