PROPOSED INCREASE IN WATER AND SEWER RATES AND CHARGES

Notice is hereby given that, on February 26, 2004, the Philadelphia Water Department filed five proposed regulations with the Department of Records to increase Water and Sewer (Wastewater) Rates and Charges. Proposed revisions to these regulations were re-filed in December 2004. The proposed regulations are as follows:

- General Service Water Rates (Sections 301.0, et seq.);
- General Service Sewer Rates (Sections 302.0, et seq.);
- Miscellaneous Water Charges (Sections 303.0, et seq.);
- Miscellaneous Sewer Charges (Sections 304.0, et seq.); and
- General Fire Service Rates (Sections 308.0, et seg.).

The proposed General Service Water Regulation and the proposed General Service Sewer Regulation provide for a four-phase rate increase. The first phase is to become effective February 1, 2005. The second, third and fourth phase will be consecutively implemented on July 1 of 2005, 2006 and 2007. The effect of the proposed increase on a typical residential water and sewer customer would be as follows:

Effective Date	Percentage Increase
February 1, 2005	15.5%
July 1, 2005	3.2%
July 1, 2006	7.7%
July 1, 2007	7.5%
