Udall Foundation Biodiesel Bus Tour To Visit the Fairmount Water Works Interpretive Center

WHAT: Udall Foundation Biodiesel Legacy Bus Tour Stop in Philadelphia

The City of Philadelphia will welcome 14 Udall Foundation Scholars for a tour of the Fairmount Water Works Interpretive Center (FWWIC), as their first stop on a crosscountry biodiesel bus tour to promote environmental awareness of lower fuel emissions. The biodiesel motor coach is an educational tool to promote clean air which in turn, improves water quality, which is the ultimate goal of the FWWIC.

The Udall Legacy Bus Tour will cover 8,606 miles in 54 days, stopping in 26 cities, six national parks, six Native American communities with 14 Udall Scholars, all on one Biodiesel Motor coach.

The Fairmount Water Works Interpretive Center, located at 640 Water Works Drive, is operated by the Philadelphia Water Department and open Tuesday through Saturday from 10:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., and on Sunday from 1:00 to 5:00 p.m. The Center is closed on Mondays and City holidays. All programs are free of charge and suitable for people of all ages and interests. The Center is fully ADA accessible.
