Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 1:37 p.m.

1. Approval of Minutes of April 19, 2007 and May 10, 2007

Boardmember Hutchinson moved approval of the minutes of April 19 and May 10, 2007. The minutes were approved unanimously.

3. Chair's Report

Chair Patterson reported on efforts to reduce obesity in the county; the Board will consider legislation relating to trans fats and menu labeling at the July Board of Health meeting and she explained the ad hoc committee working on this issue.

4. Board Member Updates

Boardmember Rasmussen reported on preparing an op-ed for HIV awareness week

5. Director's Report

Dr. Fleming solicited questions from the boardmembers. He remarked on the increase of tuberculosis cases in the county; there was a 16% increase from 2005 to 2006, and a further increase so far in 2007. The increase appears to be partly from the increase in number of foreign-born in the county. He also reported that the Atlanta XDR (highly drug resistant) strain is not present in KC, although there are some different resistant strains in the county. He discussed other indicators for tuberculosis, which occurs when the immune system is stressed; the elderly, HIV-positives, the poor and the homeless are more at risk. Dr. Fleming indicated that there is not an epidemic of tuberculosis in the county.

When asked about West Nile Virus, Dr. Fleming reported that it first appears in birds, then in humans. Human cases are most likely in August and September. Dr. Fleming will report more on this subject at a later meeting.

Dr. Fleming was also asked about drownings. He indicated that the department's influence is through public education. The two most important things to remember to prevent drownings are: (1) wear life vest and make sure children wear life vest, and (2) diving into cold water (rivers) can decrease strength and increase risk.

6. Administrator's Report

Board administrator Kathy Uhlorn presented a chart on health rankings of the states, a revised Board of Health work program and information on a budget proviso in the 2007 King County budget requiring a report on pedestrian deaths in King County. She also requested that the Chair appoint two members to the on-site sewage advisory committee. Boardmembers Dunn and Nicola were nominated. Boardmember Hutchinson moved to approve the appointments; Boardmember Counts seconded the motion. The motion was adopted by a vote of 11-0 (Boardmembers Ferguson and von Reichbauer excused).

7. Recognition

Presentation of a Recognition to Operation Storefront Students

The Board recognized Operation Storefront. Boardmembers Rasmussen and Patterson read the resolution. Project leader Sopha Dahn and student Danny Huang described the program.
