Protocol to Amend the 1949 Convention on the Establishment of an Inter-American Tropical Tuna Commission

Done: Guayaquil, Ecuador; June 11, 1999

In accordance with Article II, paragraph 1, the Protocol was opened for signature at Guayaquil, Ecuador, on June 11, 1999 by all States that are High Contracting Parties to the 1949 Convention on the Establishment of an Inter-American Tropical Tuna Commission (the "Convention") and thereafter shall

remain open for signature at Washington.

Entry into force: [not yet in force]

In accordance with Article II, paragraph 2, the Protocol is subject to ratification, acceptance, approval or accession, in accordance with the domestic laws and procedures of each Party.

In accordance with Article II, paragraph 4, the Protocol shall enter into force on the thirtieth day following the date upon which all High Contracting Parties to the Convention have indicated their consent to be bound [to the Depositary, the Government of the United States of America], as provided in Article II,

paragraph 2 of the Protocol.
