SUBJECT: Fiscal Year (FY) 2003 Penalty Mail Allocation

The attached table reflects your allocation of FY 2003 penalty mail funds. This allocation is for informational purposes only. As you know, payments to the U.S. Postal Service are processed directly by the Department of Agriculture, Cooperative State Research, Education and Extension Service.

The same formula used in the prior years to develop the penalty mail allocation was used this year. The formula is designed to recognize factors which are directly related to the usage of penalty mail. These factors include: (1) total Federal funds, (2) professional full-time equivalents, and (3) population characteristics of the States. Therefore, one-third of the penalty mail funds are distributed on the basis of Federal funds (all Federal funds appropriated to Extension activities for payments to States, except special project funds not distributed under a formula); one-third on the basis of professional FTE's (utilizing data reflected in your latest State Extension Budget); and one-third based on a combination of total, rural, and farm population in each State (using 2000 Census data).

The penalty mail savings will be released in the next funding authorization under the Payment Management System. The savings can be used for any other official penalty mail activity including the cost of purchasing or leasing meters. Any State whose usage exceeded their allocation in FY 2002 will be issued a bill for collection.

Section 203 of the Agricultural Research, Extension, and Education Reform Act of 1998 (AREERA) (Pub. L. No. 105-185) amends section 3 of the Smith-Lever Act (7 U.S.C. 343) by requiring all funds authorized under section 3 (b) and (c) be fully matched out of non-Federal funds. This applies to penalty mail formula programs. These funds used to match penalty mail formula funds may be used for any extension activity approved as part of the Plan of Work.
