SUBJECT: FY 2008 Distribution of the Expanded Food and Nutrition Education Program (EFNEP) Funding Authorized under Section 3(d) of the Smith-Lever Act

Attached is a tabulation reflecting your institution's share of the fiscal year (FY) 2008 formula allocation for the Expanded Food and Nutrition Education Program (EFNEP) appropriated under section 3(d) of the Smith-Lever Act. These funds are allocated under section 1425(c) of the National Agricultural Research, Extension, and Teaching Policy Act of 1977 (NARETPA) (7 U.S.C. 3175(c)). Beginning in FY 2006, allocations are being provided to the 1890 Land-Grant Institutions, including Tuskegee University and West Virginia State University. Since funds appropriated for EFNEP in FY 2008 exceed the FY 1995 funding level (which also is the highest level of funding for the program), 1890 Land-Grant Institutions, including Tuskegee University and West Virginia State University, will continue to be eligible to participate in the annual funding allocations for this program. Section 883 of the Federal Agriculture Improvement and Reform Act of 1996 amended section 3(d) of the Smith-Lever Act to allow 1890 Land-Grant Institutions, including Tuskegee University and West Virginia State University, to apply for and receive funding directly for programs authorized under Smith-Lever Act section 3(d) when the funding level exceeds the highest amount made available for the program in FY 1995 or any other previous fiscal year. Further, pursuant to Section 20124 of H. J. Res. 20, payments pursuant to section 1425(c) of the NARETPA (7 U.S.C. 3175(c)) to all institutions eligible under section 3(d)(2) of the Smith-Lever Act which would otherwise have received a payment of less than \$100,000 have been adjusted so that no institution received a payment of less than \$100,000.

Section 7116 of the Food, Conservation, and Energy Act of 2008 (FCEA) amended section 1425 of the NARETPA to revise the EFNEP formula for increases above the FY 2007 appropriated level. This amendment provides that, in FY 2009, 10 percent of the increase above the FY 2007 appropriated level be allocated to the 1890 Land-Grant Institutions according to each institution's prorata share based on the latest decennial census of the population living at or below 125 percent of the income poverty guidelines. CSREES implemented this component of the current formula for the FY 2008 allocation.

As stated in my April 9, 2008 memorandum, "Update on CSREES Formula Policies and Procedures," CSREES will be transitioning to Grants.gov in FY 2008 for the submission of all administrative requirements via the SF-424 Mandatory Application Forms. CSREES will be soliciting for these applications via Formula Grant Opportunities (FGOs) which will provide instructions for the completion of these application forms. CSREES will notify eligible institutions when the instructions and forms are available on the Grants.gov site. Please note that this process will not change any current reporting processes such as the Plan of Work or the Current Research Information System. The FGO for this program will be released per my April 9, 2008 memorandum.

These funds will be made available on a quarterly basis through the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services' Payment Management System.
