SUBJECT: ADDITIONAL RECIPROCATING NATIONS

The purpose of this letter is to inform you that the federal Office of Child Support Enforcement (OCSE) issued Dear Colleague Letter (DCL) 04-46 to announce four new federal level international reciprocity agreements on child support. Switzerland and the Canadian Provinces of New Brunswick, Northwest Territories and Nunavut have been declared "foreign reciprocating countries" (FRCs) for child support enforcement purposes.

Pursuant to these agreements, the local child support agencies (LCSAs) are required to accept requests for services from these foreign jurisdictions and to provide the same services that are provided with other interstate requests. Outgoing requests for child support services are to be sent to the FRCs' respective Central Authorities. Attached is a list with the addresses, phone and facsimile numbers for these additional reciprocating Central Authorities.
